Director Koeckes said she was asked to come if they had questions on GivePulse. She can give a formal presentation later.

Senator Crupi asked how it would word for leaders of other organizations to have events approved. The hours he did were not on give pulse since the manager didn't know about it. He asked if they can track hours retroactively.

Director Koeckes said they need to increase the number of community partners. They have 35 now but need to expand that. The second part is yes, they can retroactively track hours but they need to work with the coordinator to see when they come in. it is still a new system so they are working out any kinks they have as a step by step process. If they are a community partner, there are the steps. New community partners cannot be approved until they have the site visits.

Senator Crupi asked how hours for fraternities and sororities will be tracked if they went to an organization that was not a partner.

Director Koeckes said that for res or Greek life, they are in the system. Over the summer, the thought was that Megan Pepper would funnel them but that is a lot. In conversations with her, they decided to designate it to each group to have them approved their own groups. They are learning things as they go. If they are not approved partners, they want them. In a year, they want 200 plus but it takes time. She was happy to answer questions at anytime and can come back or they can meet in her office.

Senator Green said that she had shirts for those that signed up in the subgroups; he asked them to grab them on their way out.

Director Long asked if they should send any organizations they work with to her.

Director Koeckes said yes. They finished out the language for the website as well and they can be directed there to find out how to become a partner. Step 1 is they fill out an Interest Form, Step 2 is a site visit, and Step 3 is they do training on GivePulse and then they are good to go.

Dr. Beattie said that traditionally, homecoming was the game celebrated after they had been on the road; it was a celebration of community. They ran into instances last year where it had lost its sense of feeling, particularly with the teams. People do intent on winning but if they are meant to bring people together, they should not see students yelling at each other. This year, the pageant will set the tone. Programming board works hard on the events and he encouraged them to set that tone within their organizations. This year there will be consequences for teams that behave that way and they will eliminate them either this year or next year. He would not want to be the person who gets his/her banned but. He read an article recently that someone wrote about homecoming having lost its meaning. As student officers, they need to set that example. They did good job planning things this year and he as hoping they embrace that attitude this year. He will also talk to team leaders about it. They are all friends with programmers but during homecoming, they cannot be friends. Don't ask them to change things and don't text them late ant night. Please do not put their board in that kind

of position, they did a great job planning things this year and have many cool events planned. He will be looking through the interns that haven't been put through yet and will send them to Chief of Staff Atienza tonight.

Senator Barragan entered the room at 5:35 pm.

7. REPORTS OF ASUN OFFICERS

- A. President of the Associated Students, Brandon Boone

President Boone said he met with the president and stakeholders for the statue project. Things are looking good with that and facilities is in contact with them for the designs and they will see designs on that. It is a bigger project than just ASUN so they will be doing some fundraising for that. The estimated price is about \$500,000. They also discussed the block n idea. Facilities has gone around and found locations for that. They now need to find a design that will work. For the Ward 3 cleanup, he thanked Senator Duvall and Director Rojas for coming. Oscar Delgado supports ASUN a lot so good to help them and the event was on GivePulse. Student Fee Review Committee, he and Sentara Feng sat on the committee last week about 4 bio classes requesting additional funds. Every single request was well prepared and got approved. For the Pack Grant Internship Program, he and VP Springmeyer are meeting with the director to discuss the marketing. Applications are available through the end of October; he asked them to push it out to their constituents to break 1000 threshold. For the Food Services Committee Meeting, he and speaker Teixeira attended that this morning. They really rely on student feedback for the decisions they make and have tried numerous ways to get more feedback. One thing Speaker Teixeira suggested

was a possible forum to discuss the food options on campus. He wanted to see if University Affairs wanted to put on the project.

Senator Bradley said she would take it

Speaker Teixeira said they wanted to model it after the parking forum they did last year with Marc Johnson.

Senator Bradley asked if it was beyond the café.

Speaker Teixeira said yes. They showed them the idea for the new engineering building and asked them what they wanted to include but no one knew.

Senator Bradley said the leadership council had a food rep as well so she will talk to them.

Speaker Teixeira asked if they meet every other week.

Senator Bradley said they meet Thursdays at 4:15 in the Nye Conference Room.

Senator Boone said the fusion TV event happening now. if they hear feedback, he wanted to know it. It was a surprise for many to see and he wanted to hear the good and the bad. Next week, he, Speaker Teixeira, and VP Springmeyer will be going to the monthly meeting with Dr. Ellis and President Johnson. IF they wanted them to pass anything along just let them know.

B. Vice President of the Associated Students, Jacob Springmeyer

VP Springmeyer said he attended the Title 9 Coalition meeting and they discussed bringing green dot. They will spend grant money to that. A major concern they have is that the training is 4 days for faculty and staff and 6 hours for students; they are looking to schedule dates in early January. Pack FIT officially began its research period. He worked with inkblot to create the survey. He also met with senators from SSW to discuss what they want to do and also encompass their events. They will be promoting mental, sexual, and physical health. They want to bring in athletics to help with promotions and they will be tabling to get feedback .they will be having prizes for participants; they can win Beats Headphones, a Fit Bit, or a hydroflask. Until he had the items could not promote it but working on getting it soon. Once they get the feedback, they will develop the marketing materials. He will be meeting biweekly Wednesdays at 2:30 with Senator Blair; if interested talk to her. The Pack Internship Program applications are open but they need the marketing materials from inkblot. Hopefully, the final flyer will be completed tomorrow to start spreading them out. He will talk with people as well. At the end of the program, they have a poster displayed with student feedback so they will use those for tabling.

C. Chief of Staff, Sebastian Atienza

Chief of Staff Atienza thanked Senators Green and T. Jackson for helping with the Getting Involved Workshop. They did have people from clubs and orgs who helped as well. For the internship application, he will get them out to them when he has them. He asked them let anyone they know that applied that hefty will be contacted soon to schedule interviews. For the university flags that will go downtown, the designs have three different and inkblot will have proof by next Wednesday so he can show them the progress. As for pack fit week, he met with inkblot to discuss their part for health week. He also worked on sexual assault week but will let Senator Bradley discuss it.

D. Deputy Chief of Staff, Michael Upton

President Boone read the report into the record: "Good evening Senators, this week was pretty calm. I met with Rachel Lucas to discuss the SNIF. We are meeting with John Sagebiel and David Dutra in the next couple weeks. They are the two who are going to help us structure her project because both of them know a lot about these evaluations and how we can get the most from them. As for Pack Friendly Business, I am still in progress of re-contacting businesses that never got back to us. I have heard back from BFF Cafe and met with Beefy's Restaurant and both are on board. Last, but not least I am meeting with the Campus Bicycle Committee at 11am on Tuesday. I will be texting Senator Smith and Blair to see if they are still willing to join. That is all, thanks."

E. Director of Campus and Public Relations, Brooklyn Lawton

F. Attorney General, Dylan Tedford

Attorney General Tedford said he wrote an opinion last night about those who have had technical issues posting their agendas online. In the Nevada Revised Statutes, they need to make sure they get them physically posted on time. If they had a legit technical issue, it is okay if they are late; it was the one exception. When it happens, they must let their superior know and get it posted as soon as they can. They should also try to post their agendas ahead of time so they aren't down to the wire but sometimes it works out that way. If they are late because something happened, they will be fine and the meetings are admissible. .If you have questions, send him an email and will he get back.

Chief Justice Bruketta asked if the posting board in Ansari had been fixed.

Senator Duvall said she was working on it and has approval from everyone needed. They need to order them now and they will see he legislation to order them in 2 weeks.

Attorney General Tedford said it was not the biggest deal because they had enough locations.

Chief Justice Bruketta asked if they should remove it from agendas for now.

Attorney General Tedford said yes.

G. Director of Programming, Casandra Hurdle

H. Director of Blue Crew, Kevin Bezick

C. Chair, Committee on Civic Engagement-Senator Green

Senator Green said this weekend will have a bunch of volunteer opportunities. There are two giant ones. The first one is this Saturday, The National Indian Education Showcase from 9 am – 4 pm. One of the reasons he thought they should go was because it was their job to reach out to diverse groups. They are looking for 140 volunteers and they should be able to supplement them with a few. Students from all over the country will be coming. It was not the whole time since there are shifts. He asked if anyone could go.

Senators Jacoby, Bradley, and Blair volunteered.

Senator Green said it was on campus and not hard to get to. They can sign up on GivePulse. Athletics is also asking for help on Sunday to help clean up Mackay Stadium after the game. They can also sign up on GivePulse. The other major opportunity will be on Monday, October 10th for STAC. It is from 9-1 and they are only 1 hour shifts. They can do all four shifts or only one; he asked if anyone can go.

Senator Bradley said they are talking about having the Holland Project maybe doing a poetry slam in the spring to work on the campus to city initiative. If they knew of any clubs, send them her way since they are looking for as many people as possible.

G. Chair, Special Committee on Safety, Sustainability, and Wellness- Senator Blair

Senator Blair said the Wolf Pack Wellness Project was going well and she went to the SEAB meeting today. It was approved for next Thursday October 13th from 11-2. Set up will be around 10:30 and take down will be around 2:30. She will put it up on the Facebook page if they wanted to table. They will be giving out little flu packets that include hand sanitizer, hand wipes, tissues, and cough drops. She will look up prices tonight and then will have a meeting on Tuesday to approve the budget.

H. Chair, Committee on Oversight-Speaker Teixeira

They sponsored it at the \$15,000 level and the only other people that have done that ever is the College of Business.

Senator Feng said he got a tour of the Wolf Shop last week and discussed a resolution that would encourage faculty to use them more and also to turn in textbooks sooner. If anyone else wants a tour they can take it.

Senator Chiu was assigned the liaison for Campus Police, the Career Studio, and the Tutoring Center. She will reach out to them and will get a tour of the Campus police next week.

Senator Blair said the CABNR town hall will be next Monday the 10th at 6 pm. She and Senator Bradley will be setting up a meeting with the dean. They wanted to bring up a new idea for a capstone class that was recommended to her.

Senator Macaballug said he and chief Justice Bruketta talked about the direction of the Judicial Branch and they will see SAS changes later.

Senator Kohler said he and senator Henderson met with the director of Undergrad Research last week. The first undergrad research forum was coming up next Thursday in the Laxalt Mining building, Room 316 at 5:30. It will be good to get students paired with mentors to get guidance on research applications.

Senator Bond met with Director Rodriguez and Phil Sharp to discuss legislation involving department based organizations. They hit a wall with it but will see legislation for that in four years. the new charity spotlight was out and was for Path to Independence.

Senator T. Jackson said he had a meeting with the dean to see what the future of the College of Business was like and how it aligned with his overarching plan. He will meet with director hurdle to discuss future policy changes. He was still trying to get in contact with the Multicultural Greek Council and University libraries in terms of liaisons.

Senator Crupi said he had been helping with advising for engineering. For Parliamentary things, he has been getting fewer questions. That made him sad but it was good that they were getting the hang of it.

Senator H Jackson said she had been going to major specific clubs within the College of Education to see how she can support them. They did ask her to let her know if other senators were part of clubs that might want to partner up with them. if they had any ideas let her know.

Senator Green said he has been working on the GivePulse push. He has been talking with the Joe about GivePulse. He went to their meeting yesterday and gave out 30 forms and got 21 back signed; he gave them to Director Partridge. He was working with Director Koeckes on different ways to get people signed up.

Senator Jordan said he met with Director Fitzsimons from Lombardi to go over some data and demographics for the Pack FIT program. This will let them know who to target in moving forward.

Senator Eshenbaugh was working on the veterans' breakfast and had a meeting with Veterans Services next week to discuss what they wanted to see from students.

Senator Henderson had been working on the major and research fair. She was also brainstorming some things she and the committee could do to impact students.

Senator Crooks reached out to the most enthusiastic journalism professors to schedule them for the research fair. A couple of them will be coming to the fair. She went to some journalism classes to take polls of what they wanted to see and one was a Snapchat filter.

Senator Jacoby said for gov. ops, he has a meeting with a rep from financial aid to review the scholarship descriptions in the SAS. He asked them to reach out to him if they had any ideas for new scholarships before Monday. He planned to contact VP Springmeyer about volunteering for green dot since it was a large part of his platform. He spoke to a few classes about the internship program. For civic engagement, he was volunteering with STAC, the program senator green talked about

Senator Duvall said she had a meeting with her dean and that went well. She also met with Legal Services to review them in the SAS. She is working on the bulletin board and that has been confirmed. She will be ordering them soon. They will be locked in Ansari so they will either need to drop off a hard copy to the 4th floor desk or they can email it. For Pennington, they will have the front desk to give a hard copy to.

Speaker Teixeira asked if they could guarantee they would be posted by 9 am if emailed.

Senator Duvall said they will forward it to whoever was working the front desk.

Dr. Beattie said they will need to look into that since agendas have to be signed. The University and Nevada accept electronic signatures but they need to keep that in mind. He asked if they will have locks or codes.

Senator Duvall said locks.

Dr. Beattie said they should get a set of keys that must be checked out from central station.

Senator Bradley was busy this week. With CABNR, they have the town hall on Monday to talk about the future of CABNR. They were able to get a Facebook page created for all students in CABNR. She was pushing for clubs to start using Facebook to advertise events. It is hard to hit target audience of students that are currently in CABNR without the Facebook page. For It's on Us, she asked them to come to her if they had ideas; . She

wanted to collaborate with as many people as possible. She will be working with RHA to get a friendly working relationship so they can partner for events and also get them on GivePulse. For SSW, she will be working with the counseling services. They are great people and very willing to work with them. She will also work with the marketing aspect with director Moore for the Pack FIT program. For homecoming, she will be talking to the arboretum board to do a tree planting. They need to touch base to see where that dialog is going.

Dr. Beattie said that right now, there is a planting set up from 8-12 for homecoming participants. He suggested they could be a part of it.

Senator Bradley will send an email to Director Hurdle.

Senator H. Jackson said that for the RHA connection, she would like to have a meeting with the people they met before. She also asked that they include Pack Provisions in that conversation.

Senator Barragan had a lot of stuff. He met with inkblot to get promotional material. Senator Blair was kind enough to coordinate a meeting. He also met with the Blind Onion to get a quote for the veterans' luncheon since they felt that would better benefit the veteran population. He also went last week to a recruitment event for the College of Science. He will continue to work with other College of Science senators to work out the logistics of their service event now that he is back in town. He will have more on WTF Nevada next week.
