AN ACT TO PURCHASE NEW VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHY EQUIPMENT FOR INKBLOT

IN THE SENATE OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS

A BILL

AN ACT TO PURCHASE NEW VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHY EQUIPMENT FOR INKBLOT

1 *Whereas*, the videography department within Inkblot Marketing has grown substantially in recent
2 years in terms of employees, video requests and product quality;

3 *Whereas*, in 2013, there was one videographer who also doubled as a graphic designer;

4 *Whereas*, in 2016, the Inkblot videography department is now comprised of four employees;

5 *Whereas*, the Inkblot videography department is currently operating with only one video camera
6 and employees are having to use personal equipment or rent equipment from other University
7 departments to fulfill the large amount of video requests;

8 *Whereas*, the Director of Inkblot Marketing foresees the department putting a stronger emphasis
9 on video and digital media in the next three to five years;

1 *Whereas*, the Director of Inkblot Marketing foresees the department being able to provide video
2 services to Tier 1 funded clubs and organizations in the coming years;

3 *Whereas*, the purchase of a Panasonic GH4 bundle that includes a protective camera cage will
4 cost \$1,297.99 and is compatible with other accessories and equipment that ASUN and Inkblot
5 Marketing already have;

6 *Whereas*, the Panasonic GH4 requires a special adapter that costs \$649.00 from B&H Photo
7 Video that allows for full digital command and control of digitally managed functions in camera
8 lenses ASUN and Inkblot Marketing already have;

9 *Whereas*, the purchase of a Canon 70mm to 200mm lens for \$649.00 will allow Inkblot's
10 photographer to better capture higher quality pictures and perform their job more efficiently,
11 allowing them to photograph more moments during events;

12 *Be it enacted by the Senate of the Associated Students*, an expenditure of \$2595.99 for the purchase of
13 video and photography equipment for use by Inkblot Marketing be taken out of the Capital Account.
