1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Speaker Teixeira called the Senate meeting to order at 5:33 pm in the Rita Laden Senate Chambers, 3rd Floor of the Joe Crowley Student Union. Presiding secretary, Andrea Godoy.

Speaker Teixeira and Senators Blair, Bond, Bradley, Chiu, Cook, Crooks, Crupi, Duvall, Eshenbaugh, Feng, Green, Henderson, T. Jackson, Jacoby, Jordan, Kohler, Macaballug, Smith, Taylor, and Urquidi were present.

Senator H. Jackson was absent excused.

Senator Barragan was tardy excused.

A quorum was present.

4. ADOPTION OF MINUTES

A. The minutes from October 5th, 2016

Senator Urquidi moved to approve the minutes from October 5th, 2016 by unanimous consent. There was no dissent; motion carried.

B. The minutes from October 12th, 2016

The minutes were unavailable.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT

Jim Fitzsimmons, Director of Campus Recreation and Wellness, came to talk about the layout of the new EL Wiegand Fitness Center. The basic design includes a training area, circulation and lobby, vertical circulation, support area, an office area, mechanical area, and of course parking for the first and second levels. A unique feature is a fitness staircase that only goes up to the fourth floor. It is something new that has never really been done by anyone ever in any kind of fitness center. They visited a ton of fitness centers that had been built in the last 10-15 years and they all had a main staircase so for the new fitness center, they decided to do one that was just for fitness. There will be an area for dumbbells and weights and squat racks. There will be locker rooms for women, men, and gender neutral. Moving to the second floor, they will have 5 fitness rooms to host loud and fast paced programs. They will also have a pilates and yoga studios as well as some lower intensity workouts. A room will be dedicated for bikes and treadmills for unique training. They will have a fusion room with some fitness apparatuses with a bridge system and heavy bags. It leaves the room open so you can do several different trainings with it. They will roll out 4 of them on the first and second floor and will have some fitness courses on them. They are the first school to install a cool system for a green ax system. On the third floor, there will be three full

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basketball courts with a track that goes around it. They will have aerobic equipment as well. The aerobic area is much larger than what they saw in Lombardi and with room to expand over time. On the fourth floor, they had a final track with awesome views. If they run to the fourth floor using the stadium stairs, it was almost a perfect mile. As they get more of the scaffolding done, he can see the amazing views. Talking about some of the equipment that will be placed inside, they put in very careful thought. They shopped every line and went to all trade shows. They did their best to shop for the best equipment. They also got custom equipment to place for them. They are going from 15 treadmills to 35 and are going to be adding lots of new equipment that they demoed at Lombardi but couldn't put it anywhere due to a lack of space. They are also updating some of the equipment for ellipticals and steppers as well as expanding their hammer strength line and their Beaver Fit lines. Beaver Fit is a local company based out of Incline and they are all Nevada grads. They bought new spinning bicycles for the cycling center. Matrix makes some of the best bicycles and have created a program called Coach by Color. It is for cycling classes to make sure participants are doing what the coach asks them. The coach can see how much wattage they are doing to see if participants are participating. The lighting for the cycling room is cool so they can do discos, blackouts, and even raves; there are two rooms set up like that. Some of the companies they are using include: QueenAX, Woodway, Precor, Life Fitness, Hammer Strength, Beaver Fit, Dynamic, Rogue, Matrix, Balanced Body, Allegro, Escape Fitness, Les Mills, Eleiko, and Troy. QueenAx is super functional and includes UFO, barre, TRX, and heavy bag training. Les Mills is great for body pump, grit, body jam, and body combat. They also have CbC (Coach by Color), Fusion, Pilates – Reformer, Chair, Yoga, and On-Ramp to Fitness. Students will also be able to do stadium training, Alpha & Omega, Zumba, curve training, air dying, club barbell, tabata boot camps, movement workshops, CrossFits, crossover symmetry, and guided meditation. Overall, Lombardi has about 17,500 s/f of equipped fitness space whereas Wiegand will have approximately 50,000 s/f of equipped space. They are going from 3 group fitness room to 7, 2 basketball courts to 3 basketball courts, 51 pieces of aerobic equipment to 130 pieces, 10 olympic/power racks/stations to 32, 17 pieces of selectorized weight machines to 36, 15 Woodway treadmills to 35, 0 Woodway curve trainers to 12, 1 airfit bike ergometers to 12, 18 plate loaded Hammer Strength/Precor machines to 34, 4 cable crossover stations to 8, 30 foot functional training apparatus to a 140 foot, 1 dumbbell training bay to 5, 0 stations for technique blocks and jerk racks to 4 stations, 15 EFX Elliptical machines to 26, 0 AMT Elliptical Stride machines to 18, 4 recumbent/upright bikes to 24, and 0 universal access cardio pieces to 4.

Speaker Teixeira asked if they were doing Allegro barbells.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said they had a pair of 12 barbells right now but because of the power racks, they are locked down. The Allegro are \$1000 apiece and really nice. The power racks they have now they have had to split them. They bring them out for workshops and classes. What they did with the dynamic power racks was that they had them customized and one of the customizations was changing the way they can store the weights on them. This allowed them to change the way they are used so they are more effective. Most of the companies they are working with have allowed them to make the equipment more customizable for the university.

Senator Green asked if there will be gender neutral bathrooms.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said yes, they will have gender neutral bathrooms and locker rooms.

Speaker Teixeira said it looked awesome.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said he was going to bring in interior pictures but not much has been done yet so they would look flat. They will do a tour later and everyone will be amazed.

Senator Smith asked if he knew when the fitness center is supposed to open.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said they were on budget and on time. Their target is to be fully operational by January 16th. They will be moving in equipment soon; trucks with equipment start coming up in December. Lombardi recreational will continue to keep operating through that time but the equipment will be brought down from it. Most of what is being taken out will be taken out the weekend they open.

Senator Eshenbaugh asked if the amounts of jobs will increase

Mr. Fitzsimmons said they will increase their staffing by 25%. They employ about 100 students now and will jump up to about 120 to 125 student employees.

Speaker Teixeira asked what the operation hours were.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said 6am until midnight and then 8 am – 8 pm on Saturdays and Sundays. They were open until midnight at Lombardi but didn't get the usage they needed. They always operated on optional membership with Lombardi but because they now have a mandatory fee, they can open earlier and close later.

Senator Urquidi asked how much the fee was.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said \$45 per semester where \$15 goes to service and construction and \$30 goes for operation.

Senator Urquidi asked what would happen with Lombardi after the new center opens.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said Lombardi's existing basketball courts would become practice courts for Athletics and their current fitness center will become Athletics' strength conditioning center. Community health sciences maintains their classrooms and offices upstairs. Campus recreation will keep the pool and a racquetball court. The other two courts and multipurpose rooms will be converted for the dance department. There will be a total of 4 groups using Lombardi. He said they can email him if they think of any other questions.

Dr. Beattie said that when they mail legislation to the speaker, they need to please copy the senate secretary and legislative clerk. He was doing an audit for the legislation since April and as they go through it, addendums for legislation is missing. When sending legislation, copy both people so that two people can have it besides the speaker. They need to send the legislation and all addendums for archiving and the legislative clerk is in charge of that.

- A. The resignation letter of Associate Justice Gasaud
Speaker Teixeira read the letter into the record:

Chief Justice Bruketta,

With this letter, I announce my resignation from the position of Associate Justice. Thank you very much for the opportunity to serve under you and continue working for ASUN for just a bit longer. The reason for my resignation is that recent events have opened up my eyes in relation to how I want to go about living my life. I have been truly woken up to the fact that life is too chaotic and short to spend your time doing things that don't make you happy. Unfortunately, ASUN has become one of those things. For my own self-health, I have decided that I no longer want to be part of ASUN. This feeling does not stem from any perceived wrong-doing or malpractice from anyone in ASUN. The decision was a personal one. I wish

you and the rest of ASUN luck on all of your pursuits. I know that ASUN will continue to work in the best interests of the student body.

7. REPORTS OF ASUN OFFICERS

A. President of the Associated Students, Brandon Boone

President Boone said WC-1 did pass last night. He mentioned to President Johnson that they wanted more hydration stations and he will put him in contact with the right people in facilities. They are eager to get more. He wants one in each academic building; if they knew their college didn't have one let him know to make it priority. He wanted to install 5 more before the end of his term but that might change since he didn't know how long installation took. He is working on securing the Reno Aces and Reno 1868 Soccer Club as pack friendly businesses. He put the Reno Aces manager in contact with Deputy Chief of Staff Upton; they will both meet with the general managers of both teams. He met with Kylie Rowe to get more students to buy TedX tickets. They will implement a campaign that Director Lawton will oversee. The event is in 2 months and they are wanting to sell more tickets. They want to make sure students are being targeted; it will be like the MyUniverCITY campaign to get them to buy tickets. if they are interested, let him know. They should all plan to be there. He got an update on the sexual conduct survey and they have received 4266 responses as of today. Anyone who has not taken it should have gotten an email. The goal is a 30% response rate so they only need about 2,000 more; they should get it by the end of the month. He and Speaker Teixeira have created a small committee to meet next week to look over the recommendations Attorney General Tedford made. If they had recommendations with typos or whatever, send it his way. He wished Senator Eshenbaugh and Public Affairs good luck for tomorrow's luncheon since he will not be there.

B. Vice President of the Associated Students, Jacob Springmeyer

VP Springmeyer said the applications for the Pack Internship program close on Sunday. Extending the deadline increased numbers but they are still waiting on the final number; he will have it next week. He met with the Pack FIT and is working with joe programming to bring a speaker on January 31st. All rooms have been booked but they needed to finalize the speaker. He and Senator Jordan met with campus rec to do a partnership fun run at Rancho San Raphael to the quad with a barbeque. He is working with Director Lawton to develop a webpage for Pack FIT and it will include videos, calendars, and current services they had planned. They are looking to do a soft launch after Thanksgiving with de-stressing events for finals. Not all materials will be finalized but the videos and stuff is being worked on now. Hopefully they will have a sneak peak before releasing. He will have orientation data from last year and this year. He asked Director Koeckes for it but she might not have gotten back yet. Overall, they had 1352 students attend getting involved workshops, 3350 attend the are you smarter than Alfie workshop, 39 attended the undergrad research workshop, and 332 parents attended the getting involved workshop. 333 transfer students attended the getting involved workshop. He will try to make a PowerPoint with statistics from last year and this year.

Speaker Teixeira asked when the run would be.

VP Springmeyer said in the spring. The video they will show is about getting outside to release emotions and to keep a positive attitude.

Senator Green asked if ASUN will be doing any of the upcoming Nevada Bounds.

VP Springmeyer did not know but could talk to Director Koeckes.

C. Chief of Staff, Sebastian Atienza

Chief of Staff Atienza said he was able to attend the University Brand Committee and they came up with 4 different positions the university wanted to take for recruitment and advertisement. They ran some data analysis of 100 students, benefactors, and faculty members to find what represented the university and that is how they came up with the 4. He and H. Jackson worked on a bill for the university flags and hoped to get the money soon. The flags are \$45 each so around \$675 total for 15 or so flags. He and Senator Bradley are meeting with blue crew to discuss an event for an athletic event, probably basketball. He attended the Pack FIT meeting today.

D. Deputy Chief of Staff, Michael Upton

Deputy Chief of Staff Upton said that SNIFF will re-open on Tuesday, November 15th. Director Moore sent the proof and it looked cool; they will print flyers and handbills and will promote it on social media now. He will be reaching out to student groups that correlate with sustainable efforts, environmental classes, and CABNR professors. He will write a memo to announce that they had different circumstances and will be opening in November. For the Pack Friendly Businesses, President Boone suggested a WuFoo form to better track businesses. He will be contacting Raul Rodriguez for that. He will be talking to Director Moore about keeping up with Pack Friendly Thursdays to promote new businesses every Thursday. He heard back from the Chamber and will meet on Friday to discuss possible connections they can do. Common Ground was a community based grocery store and he will go to a meeting on Sunday from 4-6 to hear what they are about and if the students could do something. It was a unique and sustainable effort that they can bring to ASUN. The campus bicycle committee emailed him Tuesday to push back the date.

Senator Barragan entered the room at 6:09 pm.

E. Director of Campus and Public Relations, Brooklyn Lawton

F. Attorney General, Dylan Tedford

Attorney General Tedford said that when they write agendas, they need to put the correct date. It has come up a few times where people change the date but not the day of the week. Agendas will say Tuesday whatever the date and that date doesn't actually exist. It is better to have meetings on dates that actually exist. For the club funding stuff from last week, the way it reads in the SAS, club funding policies are presented for approval and could be individual or a book. They can approve or disapprove but could not change them; they can make suggestions that can be taken into consideration. If they schedule meetings for next week, Friday is Veterans Day and did not count. They needed to get agenda items by tomorrow.

Senator Crupi said that they could bring a set of policies or the entire manual to approve or deny. He asked if that was for funding policies.

Attorney General Tedford said they could approve their funding policies but not the procedures manual; they change their procedures and let senate know.

G. Director of Programming, Casandra Hurdle

H. Director of Blue Crew, Kevin Bezick

I. Director of Clubs and Organizations, Richard Long

Director Long said they thought they only had to present the changes but discovered that they do have to be voted on, but procedures didn't. This brought them down to Robert's Rules of Order. The motion at the end of the meeting last week was to table indefinitely but it can be brought back by a senator that voted favorably; it was confirmed by Senator Crupi. He was asking a senator to bring it back today if they voted to table last week. They can get a decision and that is what he wanted since from there, he could break it down and take bits and pieces for the policy manual to better the department. If not voted favorably today, they would not have the time to change anything before the funding hearing next week.

Speaker Teixeira said they will go over that next week.

Senator Crupi said that for motions to reconsider, if a senator does choose to do that, then it would just be from the prevailing side. Because it passed, it must pass by 2/3s vote after moving to reconsider. If they are intending on doing that, it should be in section 19.

Director Long will wait until the end of the meeting if that is the case.

J. Director of Legislative Affairs, Veronica Charles

Director Charles said the department will be tabling tomorrow offering refreshments and discussing major two bills in the community – SB 343 and HB 5162. Both are federally funded operations that they are looking into. With elections over, they are working on bringing a panel of newly elected officials to discuss the issues affecting campus.

K. Director of Diversity and Inclusion, Gabriel Rojas

President Boone read the report into the record: "Unity Week is set for April 9th-15th. I am planning on starting the week with painting the N rainbow colors and ending the week with the GRI conference. International Education Week is next week and if senate gets out early, the Black Student Organization Forum is taking place from 6-9pm tonight."

L. Elections Chair, Steven McNeece

M. Chief Justice, Samuel Bruketta

Chief Justice Bruketta said he brought a new intern to introduce herself.

Alexa Slotterback said she was excited to be a part of ASUN. She learned about the overall mission of ASUN and its purpose. It was amazing to be a part of it. During the first internship workshop, they learned about the SAS and the different branches and what they are doing. They all have projects they are working on with their chief justices.

Chief Justice Bruketta said that their mediation program was down in LA and they met with Stanford, Northwest, and Virginia about their mediation programs. They're actually tailored to law schools and are handled by law students so they are a little different than the way UNR wanted to go. He has a meeting next week with Ms. Laden about how the program will be developed to have something ready for the end of the semester. They will be having an open meeting on Friday from 4:15 – 5 pm. They are all welcome to attend; it will be in the Kaiser Conference Room in the KC. They will be having a presentation from 3 – 4 pm in the Kaiser Conference Room from Gary Cardinal. He asked if anyone would be interested in attending.

Senators Eshenbaugh, Bradley, and Green were interested.

Chief Justice Bruketta said they had a resignation coming out of his department. He asked them to please extend the information out to their constituents; if they wanted to set up times to discuss the position, just let him know.

N. Speaker Pro-Tempore, Hannah Jackson

O. Speaker of the Senate, Noah Teixeira

Speaker Teixeira said he and Boone put together a committee to put together legislation for the SAS. Attorney General Tedford and a few other senators will be there as well. That will be next Friday so they should see legislation after Thanksgiving; there will be no Senate meeting the day before Thanksgiving. He was working with Special Projects Coordinator Rash so if they need new business cards or name tags let him know. He was talking to Scott Mencing about a scholarship where his department would match anything ASUN puts forward. He has a meeting scheduled for next Thursday to talk about how it would work. Friday at 4 will be Speaker's Task Force. They will be meeting regularly to discuss outreach and to find something new for WTF Nevada. He had 6 people not in ASUN and would like to have at least 3 people in ASUN. He asked if anyone wanted to join. Senator H. Jackson had already volunteered so he asked for at least two others.

Senators Jordan and Taylor volunteered.

Speaker Teixeira said they will meet for the first time on Friday at 4.

Senator Bradley clarified that it was at the same time as Budget and Finance.

Senator Taylor said he had Budget and Finance and could not do the Task Force.

Senator Blair asked if they were meeting this week even though it was a holiday

Speaker Teixeira said yes.

8. REPORT OF THE SENATE COMMITTEES

A. Chair, Committee on Academics-Senator Henderson

Senator Henderson said they will be meeting tomorrow to go over their plans. She went to the meeting for student insurance and brought charts they passed out. It was all the data they collected for medical school and grad students since they must buy the insurance. They also had data for undergrads that prances supplemental insurance. It also said what the money was spent on for those that had insurance and it was prescriptions. Prescriptions were the highest amount for all students. That as interesting and a representation of how their society worked. It made more sense for when it came here. What was going to happen was that either the university will not offer insurance for undergrads or it will be required. It cannot stay on the path they had now; it was not an option. Most likely, even if they didn't approve it, it will become that way. Health care providers want to make money, that was the world they lived in and it was the real situation. Insurance was a good thing even though it sucked that United Health and Wells Fargo were doing that. The steps they could take were that they can they offer some type of supplement for those that can't afford it. As ASUN, they need to decide if they wanted to

provide some kind of financial aid. They will not see it this session but they will be paving the way for later sessions.

Speaker Teixeira said their decision will be to decide how they feel about it. They will not make a definitive decision but a suggestion from the 84th session.

Senator Henderson said they could say that they favor all students having insurance if they had steps to protect DACA students and those who couldn't afford it. They didn't want to deter students from coming since that was an additional \$2,000. The insurance people were open to hearing from them since they wanted student input.

Senator Crupi said there have been past sessions that state what they feel what future session should do. That was a good thing to do with the current state of health care. As of last night, healthcare would change a little bit so they could not do anything now.

Senator Henderson said that they also brought up the situation of having someone that didn't have insurance walking home and getting hit by a car. That person would be \$100,000 in debt so in comparison, \$2,000 a year looked great. They are healthy but also prone to accidents in their age so having insurance is a great thing. If they do get sick, they should be able to go to the doctor. It is a matter of protecting the people.

Speaker Teixeira asked if Senator Henderson wanted to talk to SSW to draft a resolution.

Senator Blair said they were doing their own research and doing a survey to see how many students might not have come if that had been in place. They are not asking if students are in support or not but how healthcare affects them.

Senator Barragan thought that within the committee, they noticed not everyone agreed so it was a complicated matter and more complicated with the election. There needs to be a lot of work done before they do a resolution.

Senator Blair said they were in support of grant aid from outside donors that might set up scholarships for undocumented students or those who don't want to use their financial aid on that.

B. Chair, Committee on Budget and Finance-Senator Feng

Senator Feng said they did financial reviews on Friday and Monday. Blue Crew, Inkblot, Sound and Lights, Wolf Pack Initiatives, and Brushfire were all reviewed. Blue Crew did not have a report tonight but they are trying to find an off-campus spot for the bonfire. They had 45-50 tickets for the UNLV game.

C. Chair, Committee on Civic Engagement-Senator Green

Senator Green said they needed to check Give Pulse to volunteer. More organizations are trying to join and are asking him to talk about Give Pulse at meetings. He needs to get back to Stacey Muse but will get back this week. The educational program he and Academics are doing is going well. The program will benefit two schools and his intern has had great ideas to make it more interactive. 2 mascots, 5 cheerleaders, and ASUN officers will be there. He was still trying to get football players to attend. The resolution being done by Senator Bond will hopefully be at the next meeting. Director Partridge still doing committee times for MLK day and they will start meeting once they had the dates. He was still

working on the know your rights campaign. Blaine Harding asked him to ask them to come to the diversity monologues. There is one tomorrow at 3 pm and they will be talking about racism, sexism, and other -isms. Even if they are not minority members, they should all go and invite any other leaders as well. They wanted to know how women felt about waling on campus and if they were safe. The biggest thing was that faculty members go but they can't talk about how students feel if students don't go. They should stop by, it was 1.5 hours. Last night watching the elections, he could see how big the spectrum was for millennials and they did a good job getting people registered.

D. Chair, Committee on Government Operations-Senator Jordan

Senator Jordan said there will be no meeting on Friday because of Veterans Day.

E. Chair, Committee on Public Affairs-Senator Eshenbaugh

Senator Eshenbaugh said the veterans luncheon was tomorrow. The committee was working hard and the banner signing went well. They can sign today. She hoped to see them all there supporting veterans.

F. Chair, Committee on University Affairs-Senator Bradley

Senator Bradley said they are working with Blue Crew for the women's and men's games and also the baseball season since it was a yearlong campaign. They wanted to work with some clubs as well. The t-shirts were coming along with other swag items. Cocoa with the Constituents is next Wednesday from 10 am - 2 pm; she will send a doodle poll for shifts. She will be there the entire time. She asked them to please invite their interns since it would be a good way for them to see what it means to be a public leader. She will email the other College of Liberal Arts senators for some things she wanted help on.

G. Chair, Committee on Safety, Sustainability and Wellness-Senator Blair

Senator Blair said the fall safety forum will be November 18th. They are still confirming some people. They are also looking into the healthcare as well and developing a stance. They will decide on the survey and questions next week. They had other projects coming up with lighting and meetings will be in the next week and half. She will have reports on that later.

H. Chair, Committee on Oversight-Speaker Teixeira

19. COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Senator Crupi said if there was a senator intending to reconsider, they needed to do that now since there are a few hoops to jump through.

Senator Blair asked Director Long what was approved in their meeting.

Director Long said they didn't approve anything this week.

Senator Blair asked if the bill they saw last week was the same bill they were talking about now.

Director Long said yes.

Senator Crupi said to clarify, if they made the motion to discuss the legislation, it would be to approve or deny and if it was denied, they could bring it back but they had a bunch of hoops to jump through

Senator Bond could not bring it back since she was not at the meeting but thought it was important they had a concrete decision either way since it impacted clubs that wanted funding.

Senator Crooks would like to bring it back.

Senator Crupi said they should request a point of privilege when they want to leave the room. He explained how bringing back the bill would work. They need to make a motion to reconsider and it must pass with a simple majority. It will go into discussion of the motion to table or postpone indefinitely. Once they are in that motion, they need 2/3s vote to go in the direction to repeal the decision. Because they need a 2/3's to vote nay on tabling to reconsider, they would go back into the motion to approve and that would go into the regular 51%. Motion to reconsider needs majority, then they would reconsider tabling and would need a 2/3s no for the next step.

Senator Crooks asked what she would need to say.

Senator Crupi asked if the bill had a number.

Secretary Godoy said legislation did not receive a number until it was passed.

Senator Crupi said they needed the entire name of the bill. They needed to talk about postponing it indefinitely. In any regular meeting, they can only reconsider something in the meeting it happened if there was a motion made and people didn't like the motion. It can be reconsidered in that meeting unless the meeting is part of a session or conference. They are a session so they can refer back to prior legislation. They could check precedent but because they had a physical copy posted last week, they are simply referring to things that were made public last week. Per Robert's Rules, they are good to go but they might need to refer to Attorney General Tedford in case they do decide without a physical copy; that might nullify the decision.

Speaker Teixeira said if it was voted down today, it could come next meeting with a physical copy on the agenda.

Senator Crupi said it was a two part. As Attorney General Tedford clarified, they can bring policies to them to be approved or denied.

Senator Crooks moved to reconsider S.B An Act To Amend The Club Support Funding Policies Manual.
T. Jackson seconded.

Senator Crupi said that those voting in favor should not talk; only the nay votes.

Senator Bradley asked if they voted I if they could talk.

Senator Crupi said they could talk about the exact bill tonight. Because they are in motion to reconsider, I votes would be to reconsider the votes. If they don't want to deal with it, they needed to vote nay.

Speaker Teixeira said if they vote nay, they can still hear the bill next week as two separate pieces of legislation.

Motion failed; S.B.Res An Act To Amend The Club Support Funding Policies Manual will not be reconsidered.

Senator Bond will talk to Director Long about what was discussed last meeting and she will bring a revised binding resolution to have updated discussion.

Speaker Teixeira said he was concerned that they had no paper copy and the public did not know that they would talk about it.

Senator Crupi said it was a lot of hoops to jump through.

Senator Eshenbaugh said they talked about making recommendations and they should all talk to clubs and organizations to see what they wanted since that would affect them.

Speaker Teixeira was happy they didn't discuss it tonight so they could talk to their constituents.

Senator Bond asked if they could make a poll to put on the page to send it out to their constituents to see if they are in support or not.

Speaker Teixeira said every senator will feel a different way; that might work for her but not for another. He suggested that all senators go out and find out how their constituents felt.

Senator Smith told Senator Bond it was hard to communicate the effects of something like that through a pole. Going out and talking to people will be more effective than writing.

Speaker Teixeira said that when they talk to clubs, they are also allowed to come to speak on public comment; they can speak their own opinions since their voice is better.

Senator Crupi said they needed to be careful with their word. If they are going to do a Facebook pole, it was not an official vote just them being curious. They need to make sure they make that clear.

Senator Jacoby said they should talk to clubs and orgs as well for a proper understanding. Some senators may not have had a strong grasp of what the department did. They should have insight from clubs and orgs before going to their constituents.

20. PUBLIC COMMENT

Senator Bond said the charity spotlight will be up on the 18th. If they wanted to know sooner, they could let her know.

Senator Barragan said that Senators Macaballug and Feng and himself will partner with facilities to do a cleanup after the game. If they wanted to come, they can sign up on Give Pulse.
