Mr. Mantle said he was passing out business cards for his business. Wanted to ask that if they had further interest, or wanted him to talk with colleges, he would like. They want to spread word of what the advocacy office does. They are here to assist any affiliates, staff, faculty, undergrad, or graduate students with their services. They are a first stop referral resource, and he does case work for individuals. Helps when they get their ups or owns. There to assist individuals who have been victimized, generally by interpersonal violence, which means sexual assault, domestic violence, stalking, cyberstalking. Anything where two people not being nice he can help if he cannot help directly can give referrals to other resources. However, because he is a privileged employee, he does not talk to anyone without consent, like lawyer or doctor in order to provide safety and security of that. Liked to be able to provide that for the university. Advocacy can be a fluid concept but he is there to help in whatever way he can. Would like to talk with them further about it. He appreciated their time.

Mr. Fitzsimmons, director of fitness. He wanted to give an update on what is happening in the gym. A little delayed because they had to get humidity in the concrete slabs down to apply flooring, primarily the rubberized flooring. That backed up the schedule. The flooring is now in and they are installing equipment. Some concern with flat work on the pass ways. Have some storms coming in and as of this morning the date was still February 13th, have not backed off and are installing equipment as such. He was disappointed that they didn't make the January 23rd date. On the upside, they have a huge investment and this is the stage that they don't want to rush, or push the contractor because of the size. Wanted the best possible product and if they rush them they will not get it. They will have a great product, thought everyone would enjoy it.

Senator Urquidi said several people asked when the last day Lombardi will be in operation

Mr. Fitzsimmons said February 6. It will take a few days to move over the equipment and a day of assembly and disassembly. They will try to keep some of the group fitness classes going, as well as the pool, will be uninterrupted.

Senator Chiu entered the room at 5:39 pm

Speaker Teixeira said he had a question from the professional staff about stationary bikes. Asked if they could have two to put in the center for Student Engagement.

Mr. Fitzsimmons said the way they did business is that all equipment has been traded in. All the spin bikes were picked up last week. The precore was traded in. Unfortunately, no.

Senator Bradley asked if Lombardi could be used for free until he gym opens

Mr. Fitzsimmons said there was no such thing as free. It's included in their tuition, so if they have been over there they can use it.

7. REPORTS OF ASUN OFFICERS

A. President of the Associated Students, Brandon Boone

President Boone said in regards to director of sustainability he and Bradley started this project before break, but aimed to create deputy chief of staff. Deputy Upton has done the role anyways, so it would be nice to make it official to catch up with other student government. The Civic Excellence Scholarship is coming to the table soon, Senator Green asked for help and he did work. would annually recognize

students that go above and beyond in the community. Hydration stations was the big project over break. Barragan pointed out that the places he mentioned were not completed and he got the full list. The project has grown significantly. Originally wanted 5 installed after meeting with Dr. Ellis and facilities and facilities they can do one in every academic building by this time next year. The bill is written and Feng has it agendaized in the next Budget and Finance meeting, so they will see it soon. Parent fund that Ellis works with agreed to fund 50% of the project, so ASUN pays the other half. Diversity survey is regarding student views on diversity as it related to faculty. Sent it to many officers but thanked Jordan, Feng, and Eshenbaugh and Green for completing the survey and thanked Directors Charles and Rojas. When it will be distributed they will rely on them to push it. Has new attorney general nomination. Up for approval tonight. Of the three that applied, he interviewed two of them and Harris was the clearest choice. He acknowledged his lack of experience with ASUN. He does have experience with governing documents, and the attribute that stuck out is that he kept coming back to the word “adaptability,” which he was looking for, because he has to adapt to every type of situation. He really appreciated that quality. If interested, the State of the City happening tomorrow. The Mayor will be talking about what is going on with Reno. Starts at 5:30-6:30, he can give more details. Only 10 more senate meetings until their term ends. Not a lot of time left, but historically people experience burnout at this time. Please don’t succumb to that. Knows it happens with elections, but the 84th session has accomplished a lot since April. Encourages them to look at it as 10 more weeks to accomplish the promises they made during their campaigns. Any project they started can be completed, two and half months is plenty of time, so please do not hesitate to start a project. The next successors can pick up where they left off if they need.

B. Vice President of the Associated Students, Jacob Springmeyer

Vice President Springmeyer said over break he, President Boone, Speaker Teixeira and Chief Atienza met with some speakers for Ted-x. He met with the AUN committee for athletics, and talked about projects. It is important as students to support their athletic teams, especially basketball. Pass along whatever Blue Crew is doing. Working on the launch for pack fit. They decided to wait to launch the campaign with the gym opening. Hopefully in the next few weeks. All the swag is in the Wolfshop, he is just waiting on the IPO to go through. They have hats, shirts, headbands, a Livestrong bracelet. They will be tabling when the fitness center opens. If anyone wants to get involved, they will schedule meetings for either Tuesday or Thursday morning. Asked Senators Jordan and Blair to get back to him so they could figure out something. Finally, he is working with Director Charles to help with the legislative luncheon. She invited all of the state legislators, it would be great to have people to show support and it’s great networking.

C. Chief of Staff, Sebastian Atienza

D. Deputy Chief of Staff, Michael Upton

Deputy Chief of Staff Upton said he met with NRES over break. They talked about Sniff and getting the natural resources department involved, they framed a proposal for net year to get students more engaged. Pushed the date back until February 15th to keep the application open since some reached out for more time. Excited to see the Environmental Science club’s project. For urgent SNIFF reject, met with Lucas and they created the background work to solidify her project. For pack friendly, they created a WuFoo form to have a business sign up more for that because it’s more efficient. He will reach out to businesses again to apply that way. Working with Joy and the chamber will be supporting them so they can have more businesses. They will meet with Inkblot for a social media campaign.

E. Director of Campus and Public Relations, Brooklyn Lawton

President Boone read the report into the record: “Over winter break Maggie and I wrote seven articles relating to health and fitness for the Pack FIT webpage. I met with Director McNeece to plan out social

media posts for Elections. I finally got in touch with the Sagebrush's Social Media Manager in regards to the Wolf Pack's "Best of 2016". She is currently creating polls for all of the categories to be posted on the Sagebrush's social media. H. Director of Blue Crew, Kevin Bezick

I. Director of Legislative Affairs, Veronica Charles

Director Charles said they will be switching from programming to legislation. Have some stuff coming up and will have more details. Sent out survey over Listserve and got a good amount of responses, but not enough. Hoped that will help serve as preliminary issues for legislation. What you write her will be pertinent to what is going on at the Nevada State legislature as well. Her department has been going to the legislature, they went last week for training. Wolf pack smart talks take place once a month on Tuesdays. On cool topics and hoped to see them. Next is the luncheon. Invited the entire legislature, including the assembly and the senate and sent letters to the governor office. So far they have a good amount of people participating, but they need more students. He sent out an email about a new position, it's a staff position, and it's great because it shows the University is listening. If people put forward the effort things can change. Had a meeting with Patricia Richards on Tuesday to discuss the Diversity Summit and the upcoming events. If this isn't on your calendar, it will be March 30th, not the 31st. Will be looking for volunteers. Will make a poll for availability. He is working on getting a

speaker. For Unity Week, they are working on coming up with events. Last project is to create a binder on the events that he has done and how to get them done. When he came into the position it was new.

K. Elections Chair, Steven McNeece

Chair McNeece said he would be passing around a paper for those who are not running for reelection.

Senator Eshenbaugh asked if the paper was for people not planning on running.

Chair McNeece said yes. They have even working on elections. They have the first info session tomorrow night, need help to push information out. Inkblot did not create Facebook events for info sessions yet but they can share once they do. Will have more info on sessions and filing workshops. Debates will be in later February. Senator Crupi asked where they get stickers.

Chair McNeece said no, but if they had ideas let him know. They will incorporate older questions but wanted contemporary questions.

Senator Jordan asked if they will do questions and answers only, or if they had a different format.

Chair McNeece said he needed to talk to Dr. Beattie, but there were issues with it getting out of control and targeting each other. They as the commission could lose control, but will consider it. They also need to consider the questions that would be appropriate for each setup.

A. Chair, Committee on Academics-Senator Henderson

Senator Henderson said they will be meeting next Thursday and will go over some old legislation for the undergrad research fund and cleaning it up.

B. Chair, Committee on Budget and Finance-Senator Feng

Senator Feng said they will have their first meeting on Monday and they will look at the hydration station legislation President Boone mentioned.

Speaker Teixeira said the bill that Feng and Chief of Staff Atienza were working on, Flags have been printed and if they wanted to see a picture, President Boone had pictures.

C. Chair, Committee on Civic Engagement-Senator Green

Senator Green said he is working on a resolution to create a Civic Engagement Scholarship. Wolf Pack Reading week is super cool, working with the community, and looking for speakers. Wanted to bring people from campus to talk about the importance of education and literacy. The Unity Card project is coming up, will be displaying in the Joe. Got people from the arts to submit their artwork to be put up. Was wondering if any senators could make January 31st through 6-8. He is doing some spoken word because he loves talking so much.

Senator Bond asked where it was.

Senator Green said the second floor of the Joe Crowley right in front of the fish bowl.

Speaker Teixeira said it was a cool event that basically took over the second floor. They set up a stage.

Senator Green said it was cool. Know Your Rights week will be March 20th-24th. They are coming up with programs to talk about special rights for communities. Working on getting organizations on Givepulse to get to 50 by the end of the year. His Committee is seeing some legislation, it's on the Civic Excellence scholarship. President Boone helped him write it, and his intern will be giving it because he thinks it is important to teach the next generation of senators.

Speaker Teixeira said everyone should go to his poetry night, he always sees a lot of Joe employees, and it would be cool to see ASUN employees too.

Senator Taylor asked what day it was.

D. Chair, Committee on Government Operations-Senator Jordan

Senator Jordan said their first meeting is next Friday.

E. Chair, Committee on Public Affairs-Senator Eshenbaugh

Senator Eshenbaugh said their meeting time is Thursdays at 9 am, starting next week and they will go over legislation since the legislative session starts in two weeks. The committee will work with Leg Affairs. She was still working with the Silver Paw Committee, which anyone on campus can nominate for the work that they do. Senator H. Jackson received the award last semester. They can do the nomination form online, but they meet monthly to review applications.

F. Chair, Committee on University Affairs-Senator Bradley

Senator Bradley said they will meet Fridays at 1:15 pm. They will be hitting this semester hard since she was a little too relaxed until now; she will push for more legislation. For Its On Us, the materials are coming in. They will be tabling and going to club meetings. They will push for pledges to pair what they are doing with something else. Will have t-shirts, stickers, a banner and buttons.

G. Chair, Committee on Safety, Sustainability and Wellness-Senator Blair

Senator Blair said SSW will meet 2:30 on Wednesdays. Will start off next Wednesday, the first. Will have two pieces of legislation to go over. Still working on the safe driving series but the people who put it on are talking to EHS.

H. Speaker Pro-Tempore, Hannah Jackson

Senator Jackson said interns are focusing on campaigns and elections. Today, McNeece will present to them about the elections packet and filing. That will be beneficial for them to ask questions and they can start working on platforms and different things with campaigns.

I. Chair, Committee on Oversight-Speaker Teixeira

Speaker Teixeira said he talked with Dr. Ellis and President Johnson. They charge students to take the bus from Sterling and the Highlands.

Dr. Ellis said they pay to ride the bus from there. That is a cost the people that collect the rent has to do.

Speaker Teixeira said they will look into making that an easier service and also making Campus E to help serve students better, since a 20-minute wait time is a lot for people who could otherwise walk home, and that is a risk. They talked about making campus cadets like what Senator Chiu wanted to do, having them go from campus to the dorm halls.

11. APPROVAL OF APPOINTMENTS OF SENATORS AND ASUN OFFICIALS

The following nominations were submitted to the Speaker of the Senate on September 28st, 2016th:

A. NOMINATION OF CAMERON HARRIS TO THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL

Senator Bradley moved to approve the nomination of Cameron Harris to the office of Attorney General. Senator T. Jackson seconded.

Mr. Harris said he is a pre-med student studying biochemistry at the university. His choice of major requires meticulous attention to detail, which is a skill he believed could be applied to the duties of Attorney General, such as interpreting documents or the constitution. He is a founding member of the Kappa Sigma chapter on campus, and he served as assistant Vice President and President. He had an opportunity to proofread, edit, and draft their own bylaws, and had practice using Roberts Rules of Order. On the topic of meetings, he has familiarized himself with the Nevada Open Meeting Law in order to hold himself and others accountable. He believed the Attorney General position is important, especially with campaigns and elections coming up. He has read the elections code as outline in the SAS, and has reached out to the Elections Chair McNeece to establish a relationship for the elections season. If any violations do occur, he plans on meeting with the person personally to address the issues before formal charges are applied. He plans on developing a personal relationship with the senators so they can work together. However, if anyone fails to comply with the rules in place, he will be the authority figure.

Senator Eshenbaugh asked what his approach would be if he had a personal relationship with someone who violated elections rules

Mr. Harris said that the justice of running campaigns is more important than personal relationships. It is the job, so it will take precedent over his personal relationships.

Senator Eshenbaugh asked how he handled conflicts.

Mr. Harris said he liked to view everything from an unbiased lens, and view each situation on its own. He liked to learn the facts of a situation before he made judgement.

Senator Macaballug asked if he intended to apply for attorney general next semester

Senator Duvall asked why he wanted to be attorney general.

Mr. Harris said he was friends with Tedford and he said he would be a good fit. Harris researched and felt he would be a good fit. Learning curve makes him more passionate.

Senator Teixeira said he was asked in oversight if he believed in the spirit of the law or the letter of the law. Asked Harris to give that answer again.

Mr. Harris said spirit of the law, because each case is different, you can't view it as black and white.

Senator Jordan asked how he planned to hold committee chairs and other members accountable

Senator Harris said he would need to familiarize himself entirely with NOML, but wanted to have a working relationship with everyone so he can reach out to them personally to explain the fault before going to the law and filing. If he had the opportunity to reach out, he will but if the wrongdoing is too severe he will go for it.

Senator Macaballug asked if he looked over the elections portion of the SAS or looked over it all

Senator Harris said he looked over it, but it is a dense document and does not know specific information, but can navigate it.

Senator Smith said he would use each case separately, but he did think that past cases serve importance for precedent. He asked how he would decide future cases using past.

Senator Harris said just because he wanted to view each case individually does not mean he will not reference past cases.

Speaker Teixeira said that when he mentioned he would look at each case, he meant without bias.

Senator Eshenbaugh enjoyed asking about personal reasons since it was a touchy subject during elections. Thought that was very considerate to the job title.

Senator Jordan said that the job was broad and he was glad he had a plan for elections and creating steps.

15. MOTIONS TO FAST-TRACK LEGISLATION

A. S.B. An Act to Create the Election Commission Internship Program

Senator Feng moved to fast-track.

Senator Barragan seconded.

Senator Jordan said McNeece came to him. He had big plans but needed more help since the commission is small. One intern per commission member will make events better, it is not paid and is extra hands. Gives option to hire intern or not so if future commissions don't want to hire, there is no need to.

Speaker Teixeira asked if they would assign interns to specific commissioners or as a whole

Senator Jordan said it was just three, and they can decide how to allocate them. He can assign all three.

Senator Crupi asked if there was anything specific in the legislation that would bar them from participating in elections if they are their intern.

Senator Jordan said they did not write anything like that but they can amend. The verbiage for other internships did not have that.

Speaker Teixeira said if they did the amendment it should be with language that said they can be an intern but cannot work with the elections commission during elections

Senator H. Jackson had concern since bulk of work was during the second semester. Crupi brought up a good point that, that should be discussed and go back to committee, and not passed tonight. Go back to committee.

Senator Eshenbaugh said all interns sign document when they start their internship. If there was a severe error made by the intern, would that be reflective of the intern chair or the intern.

Speaker Teixeira asked if she was wondering if the intern makes an error, would it reflect on the chair.

Senator Eshenbaugh said yes and asked how it would be settled since they are not an employee of ASUN.

Speaker Teixeira said it was up to the elections chair to make sure they don't do anything like that but they can add language.

Senator Jacoby said they should not bar interns from getting the plan to run. An intern in this position would want to be on the elections commission. They must know that beforehand if they want to run or be an exec position they can.

Senator Crupi said that was what he was going for. It wouldn't make sense to have an intern run for ASUN. On Eshenbaugh's point, it would fall on the elections chair, that is why they sign off on legislation, so someone can take responsibility for that.

Speaker Teixeira asked if they would make an amendment.

Dr. Beattie said that although not written, if President Boone was going to run for president, he would not be allowed to help with interns. Last year there was an issue with the barbeque. If they wanted to run for senate, they would be asked to resign from their internship.

Senator Crupi wasn't stating that it needed to be in word the precedent would just need to

Senator H. Jackson recommended it be sent back to committee where some language can be constructed. Big to talk about at the senate table, thought it needed to be discussed more and have the language figured out.

Speaker Teixeira said McNeece needed the interns now because he is starting a project and needs more staff members. It was put on fast-track to hire people if he comes across someone within the program this year, they can ask him to fire someone if they run for senate. They need to hold McNeece accountable. They can vote on it tonight that way he can get staff to run elections successfully.

Senator Jordan said that the chapter was thoughtfully instructed and was taken from templates the tone internship programs to match working for elections. It reads the same.

Speaker Teixeira said if he were to get any applicants, would he allow them to run for senate while they work for him.

Senator McNeece said no. He has two assistants and the same rules apply to them as well.

Senator H. Jackson was curious what the application process would be like and how long it would be open

Senator McNeece said it would Be like the other applicants with a WuFoo form after about 2 weeks to a month they would close it. Wanted interns for at least the debate, and the physical polling locations because they are open for eight hours. If not, at least in the SAS so they have them later.

Senator H. Jackson said for future years, they had talked about how most of the work for the elections commission happens in the second semester. For the future, would he plan on that being the entire year, or just the second semester.

Senator McNeece said it would be the entire year. One of the major reasons he is considering interns is because every year they struggle to get people to apply. Getting students informed about this department would help.

A. S.B. An Act to Create the Election Commission Internship Program

Senator Crupi moved to approve S.B. An Act to Create the Election Commission Internship Program by unanimous consent.

There was no dissent; motion carried.

18. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

A. WTF Nevada ASUN

Senator Barragan asked for suggestions from Dr. Charles.

Speaker Teixeira said that the student he outreached came up with great ideas, but all of them were already being done with ASUN. This leads him to his other point, which was to get rid of ASUN.

Senator Barragan agreed.

Speaker Teixeira said next Senate Meeting he will put legislation up on the table to get rid of WTF Nevada. If someone emails him ideas about something they can change it into, they can talk about that next meeting.
