Director Long will now hear the funding request of the MEDLIFE Nevada club.

Director Long stated for our records can we get your positions within your organizations.

The President and the Treasurer were present at this meeting.

First we will discuss your tier 5 application.

Commissioner Ronquillo reviewed their application and it looked to be in order, therefore he moved to approve MEDLIFE Nevada's Tier 5 application for the amount of 246.63.

Commissioner Bittar seconded the motion

Director Long asked if there was any discussion on the motion.

Commissioner Wang stated that they do not have enough money. They have exceeded their tier cap.

Director Long asked how much they have gone over in their tier 5 cap.

Commissioner Wang replied that they only have 32 cents.

Director Long stated that they cap tier 5 applications to 250 dollars per club per year. He then asked Commissioner Wang is she had any of their old applications from the past. Commissioner Wang explained that they requested money in the Fall as well for \$209.68. She then asked if they spent all of that money

The representatives explained that they did not spend all of the money.

Commissioner Wang explained that the policy is that if you do not spend all of the money then you need to remit the rest back. If not it is as if you have spent all the money.

Funding Manager Desmaro stated that he regularly sends an email out roughly a week before the funding hearing to remind people to remit the money that they did not spend so we can put it towards the new applications.

The Representative stated that they did get the email and was wondering if it was for the last one or fall 1 hearing.

Funding Manager Desmaro explained that he changed it from fall 1 to fall 2 and that it is all the same text they just swap out the funding session. He then asked if they wanted the 32 cents.

Representatives laughed and stated they do not need the 32 cents.

Director Long then motioned to postponed the application.

Commissioner Ronquillo moved to postpone.
Motioned carried.

Commissioner Wang reviewed the Tier 4 application and they once again requested too much money and exceeds their limit.

They will only be eligible for 434.55

They would like the rest of the money

Commissioner Hidalgo stated that they did not have the supporting documents but it was claimed to be fine because they turned in flyers that explained the pricing. I move to strike line item 3 unanimously
Motion carried.

Commissioner Hidalgo motioned to approve the application in the amount of 434. 55.
Seconded by commissioner Ronquillo.
Motioned carried.

Director Long sought a motion to indefinitely postpone the Management and Human Resources club application.
Commissioner Ronquillo seconded the motion.
Motioned carried.

Commissioner Bittar motioned to recess until 8:28 AM
Seconded by commissioner hidalgo.
Motioned Carried.

Director Long recalled the meeting of Clubs and Orgs at 8:28 AM in the Rita Linden Senate Chambers on the 3rd floor of the Joe Crowley Student Union. Director Long, Funding Manager Desamero, Club Commissioner Bittar, Club Commissioner Carrasco, Commissioner Hidalgo, Club Commissioner Ronquillo, Club Commissioner Tarr, Club Commissioner Wang were all present. Quorum was present.

Director Long then stated that we will be hearing the application from the Nevada Ultimate Frisbee Club
. Neither of the representatives were ASUN appointed or elected officials.

Move into their tier 2 application

Commissioner Bittar stated that they are requesting 540 dollars. Everything looks good for their application

Commissioner Wang stated that they will exceed their tier 2 cap by 70 dollars.

Commissioner Bittar then moved to approve this application in the amount of 540 dollars.
Seconded by Commissioner Tarr
Motioned Carried.

Moving into their second tier 2 application in the amount of 225 dollars

Commissioner Bittar asked how much money they have remaining.

Commissioner Wang stated that they have 215 dollars

Commissioner Bittar moved to approve the application in the amount of \$215.
Seconded by commissioner Ronquillo
Motion Carried.

Commissioner Bittar motioned to recess until 8:40
Seconded by commissioner hidalgo.
Motion Carried.

Director Long called the meeting of Clubs and Organizations to order at 8:41 am on Saturday February 4th 2017 in the Rita Laden Senate Chambers on the 3rd floor of the Crowley Student Union. Director Long, Funding Manager Desamero, Club Commissioner Bittar, Club Commissioner Carrasco, Club Commissioner Hidalgo, Club Commissioner Ronquillo, Club Commissioner Tarr, Club Commissioner Wang were all present. Quorum was present.

Commissioner Bittar motioned to recess until 9 am
Seconded by commissioner Hidalgo

Commissioner Tarr friendly amended until 8:55 am
Commissioner Bittar respectfully declined

Commissioner Tarr would like to friendly amend to 8:58
Commissioner Bittar accepted.

Motioned Carried; the commission will recess until 8:58 AM.

Director Long called the meeting of Clubs and Organizations to order at 8:11am on Saturday February 4th 2017 in the Rita Laden Senate Chambers on the 3rd floor of the Crowley Student Union. Roll Call: Director Long, Funding Manager Desmaro, Club Commissioner Bittar, Club Commissioner Carasco, Club Commissioner Hidalgo, Club Commissioner Ronquillo, Club Commissioner Tarr, Club Commissioner Wang were all present. Quorum was present.

Hearing the application from Men's Lacrosse

President and Treasurer and neither are ASUN elected or appointed officials.

Commissioner Ronquillo reviewed the application and stated that just so you are aware of our capital expenditure Policy if it is more than 33 dollars, it needs to last more than 2 to 3 years.

Representative stated that it may not last that long since it is taking shots

Commissioner Ronquillo asked if the director is all right with the purchasing of this capital expenditure since they will not be lasting for more than 2-3 years.

Representative stated that the purpose of these nets are to go behind our goals on the North and South side of the field to stop the ball from flying into an area where there could be spectators or civilians, it is mostly a safety issue.

Commissioner Wang stated that she is ok with this because they have allowed other organizations to do something similar in the past.

Commissioner Ronquillo wanted to check that they had enough funds in their account, which they did.

Commissioner Ronquillo then motioned to approve this application for 500 dollars
Commissioner by second Commissioner Bittar.
Motioned Carried.

Funding Manager Desamero asked that in our records the organization requested a tier 1 and a tier 4 in the fall, which caused our records to get messed up, and he needed confirmation

Representative stated that he does not remember applying for a tier 4 in the fall; he only requested a tier 1 application.

Funding Manager Desamero asked if they remembered coming into a meeting for the funding.

Representative stated that he messed up the name on the title of the organization and stated that he named it Acro Yoga and therefore was unable to get the approval of the application

The other member was a proxy and the email was sent to Commissioner Hidalgo.

Commissioner Wang stated that this was for their home game and they need lacrosse balls and other items, it still goes over the cap. Also I am unsure if I notified you at all but I am curious if you are using ESI at all.

Representative stated that they are switching to the CSE because that is what we are going to move towards. It is different now but Lombardi will always have a staff member on site as well.
There is a base rate for CSE and it is 18 dollars per hour.

Commissioner Wang Motioned to add to line item three in the quantity of 4 and the price of 18 by unanimous consent.
Motion carried.

Commissioner Wang motioned to approve the application for Men's Lacrosse for tier 1 at \$313.87
Seconded by commissioner Tarr
Motioned Carried.

Director Long called the Department of Clubs and Organizations to order at 9:50 am in the Rita Laden Senate Chambers, 3rd Floor of the Joe Crowley Student Union. Presiding secretary, Andrea Godoy. Roll Call: Director Long, CSFM Desamero, and Commissioners Bittar, Carrasco, Hidalgo, Ronquillo, Tarr, and Wang were present. A quorum was present.

Nevada Neuro Society sent the president and treasurer; they are not ASUN officials.

Commissioner Ronquillo moved to approve Nevada Neuro Society's tier 5 app for \$81.75
Commissioner Tarr seconded.
Motion carried.

Director Long passed the gavel to CSFM Desamero.
CSFM Desamero accepted

Commissioner Ronquillo left the room at 9:54 am*

Nevada Blue Key Society sent the sponsorship chair and the joy prom director; they are not ASUN officials. CSFM Desamero received the proxy emails.

Commissioner Tarr said their application looked okay; asked them to tell the commission about it.

Blue Key said the funding was to help fund one of the fundraisers they do for Joy Prom. They will use the funds to buy flowers or the fundraiser. They will sell the flowers and then on Valentine's day, they will deliver the flowers.

Commissioner Wang asked if the fundraiser was for the club.

Nevada Blue Key Society said it went to Joy Prom, a philanthropy event they do.

Commissioner Bittar asked what Joy prom was.

Blue Key said it was a prom for special needs students in the Washoe County area. It was put on by Blue Key and Washoe County.

Commissioner Tarr asked when it was.

Blue key said may 6th, from 6-9 pm in the discovery museum.

Commissioner Hidalgo said that since it was fundraising for their event, it could stay in the current tier.

Commissioner Tarr said it was tier 5 because of who the event was for and what they were serving.

Commissioner Wang said they hadn't used any tier 4.

Commissioner Bittar asked if she thought it wasn't a community service event.

Commissioner Wang said she could see it both ways. They had the money for tier 4 funding.

Commissioner Tarr said that tier 5 was to provide community service in the community through direct, democratic engagement of club members; he saw tier 5 for the actual event; you don't fundraise to buy the actual event.

Commissioner Bittar said if it was tier 5 they would apply for expenses of joy prom.

Commissioner Tarr recommended they move it to tier 4 and at the next hearing, use the tier 5 for the direct expenses of the event

Commissioner Wang asked if they were doing anything for tier 4.

Nevada Blue Key Society said most of their funds were for the joy prom.

Commissioner Tarr said that mathematically, they would benefit from moving it to tier 4; it will work out.

Commissioner Wang move to relegate Nevada Blue Key's tier 5 application to tier 4
Commissioner Hidalgo seconded.

Commissioner Tarr asked if they were okay with it.

Nevada Blue Key Society said yes.

Commissioner Bittar said it was still 100% funded by ASUN.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Hidalgo moved to approve Nevada Blue Key's tier 4 app for \$250.

Commissioner Tarr seconded.

Motion carried.

CSFM Desamero pass the gavel back to Director Long.
Director Long accepted.

Commissioner Carrasco left the room at 10:02 am

Nevada Students for Life sent the treasurer and the president: they are not ASUN officials. Their tier 4 application was to request an embryology text book that they would use to educate their members and officers on the exact science of embryology and prolife. It comes with a one year membership for a 1-year membership to a prolife forum. It will be purchased for 20 members and will get 20 access codes; each member will have access to the forum and to the resources.

Commissioner Hidalgo said it was a capital expenditure; he asked how they wanted to do it.

Commissioner Wang said it was for a 1 year membership only; it was not a capital expenditure.

Commissioner Hidalgo moved to approve Nevada Students for Life tier 4 application for \$237.

Commissioner Bittar seconded.

Motion carried.

Nevada Taekwondo Club sent the president and treasurer; they are not ASUN officials.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Ronquillo left the room at 10:09 am

Nevada Student Ambassadors sent the president and treasurer; they are not ASUN officials.
CSFM Desamero said their account was low.

Nevada Student Ambassadors said they deposited about \$150 not too long ago.

Commissioner Hidalgo asked them to tell about the application.

Nevada Student Ambassadors said that this event was for members that passed the joe training and they went to expect what a tour I lie and what the organization was about as well as the committees and how to mingle. It was a training day for them to understand what they have to do.

Commissioner Hidalgo said the application was fine.

Director Miller asked if they had a contact for whoever put the money in.

Nevada Ambassadors said their advisor was going to contact whoever was in charge to deposit money.

Commissioner Bittar asked if they had enough money.

CSFM Desamero said he was checking.

Commissioner Bittar moved to change nonfood 1 to quantity \$624 unit price \$0.54.
There was no dissent; motion carried.

CSFM Desamero said they were short to cover the 40%. He asked if they deposited anything by the deadline.

Omega Delta Phi was not sure.

Director Long said the due date was the Monday before the funding hearing.

CSFM Desamero said the deadlines are always listed on the website.

Omega Delta Phi said they can use the account balance as the 40% and approve them for full 60% for that amount.

CSFM Desamero asked if they wanted to know the full amount.

Omega Delta Phi said yes.

Director Long said they could approve them for \$308.70

Commissioner Bittar moved to approve Omega Delta Phi's tier 2 app for \$308.70
Commissioner Hidalgo seconded.
Motion carried.

Commissioner Ronquillo reviewed the tier 5 app. They are having a 5K event and partnered with another organization. It all looked good.

Commissioner Ronquillo moved to approve Omega Delta Phi's tier 5 app for \$134.
Commissioner Hidalgo seconded
Motion carried.

Commissioner Wang left the room at 11:57 am.

Outdoor Adventures Club sent the president and vice president; proxy notice was sent. They are not ASUN officials.

Commissioner Bittar said that for the tier 2, they applied for a registration fee that fulfilled the requirements for tier 4. He saw it as a tier 4.

Commissioner Hidalgo said they would travel.

Commissioner Bittar said it could be both ways. It was a tour so it could be infrastructure.

Commissioner Tarr said it payed for registration, not the travelling.

Commissioner Bittar moved to relegate Outdoor Adventures Club's tier 2 to tier 4 by unanimous consent. There was no dissent; motion carried.

Commissioner Bittar moved to approve Outdoor Adventures Club's tier 4 app for \$300. Commissioner Hidalgo seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bittar said the tier 2 app was for gas for 3 cars.

Commissioner Bittar moved to approve Outdoor Adventures Club's tier 2 app for \$346.03. Commissioner Hidalgo seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Wang entered the room at 12:02 pm.

NSSLHA said the group they are going with already purchased tickets. They didn't know that had had been done already. It came from an account where there was not enough to sustain what they planned to do so they wanted to do fundraising. They bought the tickets and have receipts with them. The other group paid for them, not NSSLHA.

Commissioner Ronquillo said that was retroactive funding where it was prepaid and they wanted reimbursement.

NSSLHA said that wasn't their intention; they were going to pay for their own tickets but the other leader was under the understanding that they could be reimbursed.

Commissioner Ronquillo said they don't do that. They can bring the application back or have them return the tickets and purchase them again.

CSFM Desamero said they don't do retroactive funding unless they return them and then buy them again.

NSSLHA asked if they had to come back to request funds after returning the tickets

Commissioner Ronquillo said no. they would just request the credit card and purchase the tickets that way.

CSFM Desamero asked if they could bring it back and put a stipulation.

Director Ayard said they were assuming the tickets would be returned. However, that isn't always something that can be done easily. They mentioned earlier that the reason they purchased the tickets was because the prices were so low. By the time they return the tickets and get the card, the prices will have gone up a lot anyways and it won't be feasible in terms of prices.

NSSLHA asked if they could transfer funds between different university accounts.

Director Miller said it depended on the account they had but they would take money out of their account and move it to the other department. In that case, it would be them cutting a check, they won't need the credit card.

Director Ayard didn't think returning the tickets would be a feasible option. They needed to make an exception or find another option.

Commissioner Wang asked what airline it was.

NSSLHA said Southwest

Commissioner Wang said they might have a return policy where they get credit towards purchasing tickets if they say it is an emergency; that may be something they can do.

Director Long said he didn't think an airline would consider it an emergency.

Commissioner Ronquillo asked if tickets had a return policy.

Director Miller asked if the person who purchased the tickets was guaranteed they would get their money back.

NSSLHA said they would be fundraising and had budget for \$9000; what wasn't fundraised would be split and they would pay their own ways.

Director Miller asked if there was an agreement that they would be given their money back.

NSSLHA said that was the circumstances when they signed up for this.

Director Miller asked if there was someone who could vouch for the agreement.

NSSLHA said yes.

Commissioner Tarr said it came down to making an exception under extreme circumstances. He asked the commission if they felt this was an extreme circumstance.

Commissioner Hidalgo thought it was fine to let it go now since it was an unforeseen event they didn't predict.

Director Miller asked it was done with a university card.

NSSLHA said probably.

Commissioner Tarr asked when they found out about the tickets already being purchased.

NSSLHA said yesterday.

Commissioner Wang asked if the tickets were \$69 each one way.

NSSLHA said a roundtrip for three people was \$258.89.

Commissioner Wang asked how much money would be saved if they went with the purchased tickets.

NSSLHA said they would save about \$100 a member.

Commissioner Tarr said the exception they would make was for the reimbursement rule. He thought it was a somewhat extreme circumstance. They are big on customer service. However, they should not ignore the rules in the name of customer service. He asked what the point of having rules if they were not going to enforce them.

Commissioner Hidalgo asked commissioner Tarr if he was saying he wanted to reimburse them.

Commissioner Tarr said they should give exception to the no list for retroactive funding. Returning a ticket and then repurchasing it was ridiculous.

Director Long asked if it was feasible.

Director Miller said it depended on the type of the account they had. She asked if it was a private card or a university card.

NSSLHA said they didn't know.

Director Miller asked because when they purchase tickets, they need to do paperwork for travelling.

NSSLHA said they assumed that the other department has or will. The advisor for the other group told them to come to her for the travel paperwork after they got the funding today.

Director Miller asked if it was going through her name.

NSSLHA said yes.

Director Long asked if that department could check.

NSSLHA asked if they could request money to be donated to an organization.

Director Long said no.

Director Miller said that after the charge shows up in the account, they could send funds over that way.

Director Long agreed with Commissioner Tarr on this. The university deals well with organizations to make things happen but there are circumstances when miscommunications happened. Sometimes that just messed with their process. It counted as a very specific case where they could use their executive power. It will be about working with central station to make it work.

Director Ayard said they pass this information along. They already know about retroactive funding now but they didn't know before since they had never applied. Now that they know, this should be something that happens again.
