1        *Whereas*, in No Walls 20205, the University of Nevada envisions students as being cognizant of  
2 their carbon footprint and actively practicing efforts in making the campus, city, and state more  
3 healthy and sustainable;<sup>2</sup>

4        *Whereas*, UNR has achieved an R1 Carnegie classification<sup>3</sup> and investment of resources in  
5 geothermal energy will allow for students in Nevada to research renewable and clean energy in the  
6 University of Nevada, Reno and in the state;

7        *Whereas*, clean and renewable energy resources will allow for the potential of the advancement of  
8 solar energy;

9        *Whereas*, in the latest National Emissions Assessment in 2014, it was reported by the Nevada
