A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A BAN ON HOSTILE, ANTI-HOMELESS ARCHITECTURE

Resolution Number: 116

Authored By: Senator Chantiyanon, Senator Franzen, and Senator Luers Sponsored By: The Committee on Safety, Sustainability and Wellness

Whereas, hostile architecture is defined as, "the design of buildings or public spaces in a way which discourages people from touching, climbing or sitting on them, with the intention of avoiding damage or use for a different purpose;"

Whereas, more specifically, anti-homeless architecture is a form of architectural design to prevent or impede crime and help maintain order;²

Whereas, a 2018 study found that 36% of college students were considered housing insecure, and 9% of university students had experienced complete homelessness within the previous year;³

Whereas, Reno has been infamously known for its "War on Homelessness;"

Whereas, in 2016, the City of Reno approved the removal of benches across Downtown Reno to prevent loitering;⁴

Whereas, in 2017, the City of Reno approved a ban on sleeping on public or private property for the homeless;⁵

Whereas, the City of Reno has also been continuing to clear out homeless camps for years;6

Whereas, homeless people rely on benches to rest;7

Whereas, anti-homeless benches are exclusionary;

Whereas, homeless students become excluded on-campus if they cannot find a place to rest oncampus;

Whereas, anti-homeless architecture can also be exclusive to plus-sized people and disabled individuals;8

Whereas, anti-homeless benches are costly;

Whereas, Iowa City spent \$150,000 on installing anti-homeless benches with armrests to prevent sleeping;9

Whereas, it cost Iowa City approximately \$150 more for each anti-homeless bench than it did standard benches;¹⁰

Whereas, funding that facilities would use to install anti-homeless architecture could be better used to support projects that would make campus a more inclusive space for all students;

Whereas, precedent already exists for programs that have successfully led to the removal of antihomeless architecture and benches;¹¹

Whereas, the homeless and insecure housing population relies on public spaces and its street furniture;

Whereas, those who are experiencing homelessness often sleep during the day in public spaces since they would usually be up all night — a form of self-defense as they must stay on high alert when alone;

Whereas, Lisa Lee, former UNR constituent and former member of the homeless populous witnessed other students sleeping on the fourth floor of the Joe Crowley Student Union Center as they rely on quiet spaces to rest during the day;

Whereas, an interview of Lisa Lee can be found in Addendum A;

Whereas, the lack of sleep/broken sleep schedule and other disruptions derived from the issue can cause mental health issues and a drop in grades;12

Whereas, many students who are homeless/financially insecure often have to hold more than one job to afford basic necessities and cover the rest of the tuition;¹³

Whereas, students can end up in dangerous areas as a result of having limited options for shelter and rest;

Whereas, The University of Nevada, Reno is an open campus, meaning anyone can come and spend time on our campus and in our buildings;

Whereas, in a semester where the campus is operating as usual it gets hundreds, if not thousands, of visitors a year, and many unhoused people seek shelter from the elements within the campus;

Whereas, students also enjoy coming to their campus to spend extended amounts of time studying or socializing in the buildings and outside, when the weather permits, and hostile architecture makes this less comfortable and pleasant;

Whereas, instances of anti-homeless architecture currently exist on campus along both sides of North Virginia Street in the form of benches with armrests between each seat and benches with extremely narrow seating panels;
