Re: Senate Reapportionment [Orvis School of Nursing]

President Jackson,

Regarding the inquiry on the apportionment of senate seats to the Orvis School of Nursing, you are correct that Article 2, Section B of the ASUN Constitution says that,

"Each college and school shall have at least one seat."

However, for accuracy, reapportionment must also be in accordance with the Statutes of the Associated Students **SAS ii.101.12.c** which states:

The basis of apportionment figures shall be the enrollment headcount of undergraduate students in each college and school that is not an administrative unit of another college or school as of the University census date for the fall semester next preceding reapportionment. The headcount shall accurately reflect actual membership in the Association, in accordance with the Constitution. [Chapter 101 Section 12]

Because, the Orvis School of Nursing is still an administrative unit of the School of Community Health Sciences, it does not qualify as an independent school and is therefore not entitled the minimum allocation of one senate seat per college as they are already afforded representation

under CHS. Moreover, the smaller, separated, population of Orvis upperclassmen students would not pass the Huntington-Hill Method of Equal Proportions for allocation which is the criteria set in the SAS, displaying ineligibility from either approaches.

Thus, the addition of a Dean, though great news, does not affect or alter the present overlap in enrollment already addressed in this section of the SAS. To continue to have the most adequate representation, reapportionment should not fragment current representation for nursing students under the School of Community Health Sciences. I hope this thoroughly addresses any outstanding concerns.
