AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 7 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE IN THE STATUES OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS

- 1 *Whereas*, The Statues of the Associated Students, Title VII, Chapter 702, Section 7,
- 2 Subsection A, details the Candidate Filing period for applicants applying for a Senate
- 3 position;
- 4 *Whereas*, The Candidate Filing period is only open five (5) days from 8am Monday to
- 5 5pm Friday;
- 6 *Whereas*, The Candidate Filing period should be more aligned with open vacancies of
- 7 Senate positions throughout a session;
- 8 *Whereas*, In the Senate Rules for the 87th Session, Rule II: Membership of Senate,
- 9 Section C, it details the appointment to fill vacant seats;

- 1 *Whereas*, In Section C it states that an open Senate seat must be advertised for two (2)
- 2 consecutive weeks;
- 3 *Whereas*, Open Senate seats are open for a minimum of two (2) weeks to get applicants
- 4 to apply for the vacant position;
- 5 *Whereas*, Extending the Candidate Filing period to align with the vacant Senate seat
- 6 minimum timeframe of two (2) weeks would be beneficial to future Senators;
- 7 *Whereas*, Two (2) weeks would give applicants more time to apply for all vacant Senate
- 8 positions;
- 9 *Be it enacted by the Senate of the Associated Students*, Addendum A is added to the
- 10 Statues of the Associated Students

Addendum A

CHAPTER 702: ELECTIONS CODE

SECTION 07: CANDIDATE FILING PERIOD

- a) TIME FRAME
 - 1) The Filing Period for candidates shall open at 8 a.m. on the **seventh eighth** Monday before General Elections commence.
 - 2) The Filing Period for candidates shall close at 5 p.m. **on the second** Friday after the Filing Period opens.
- b) CANDIDATE FILING FORM:
 - 1) Each candidate shall file a Candidate Filing Form with the Director of Elections and Democratic Education during the Filing Period. Candidates for all positions must indicate their desire to run by completing an official Candidate Filing Form during the Filing Period.
 - 2) The Candidate Filing Form shall be provided by the Director of Elections and Democratic Education and made available to the public.
 - 3) Candidate Filing Forms may be filed online via the ASUN official website.
 - 4) The Candidate Filing Form shall include:
 - i. The candidate's name as it is to appear on the election ballot;
 - ii. The office the Candidate is seeking;
 - iii. Contact information of the candidate; iv. A list of campaign managers or individuals who are directly affiliated with the candidate's campaign; Eligibility Requirement Verification: An electronic signature or acknowledgement that informs the candidate giving permission only for the Associate Director of **the** Center for Student Engagement, or designee, to verify the candidate's GPA and credit load to determine whether that candidate is eligible for elections.
 - v. Candidate Platform or Statement
 - vi. A statement relating that the candidate is responsible for all information contained in the Elections **s** Code and the information that will also be presented at the Candidates' Meeting.
- c) DEADLINE FOR WITHDRAWAL:
 - 1) Candidates may withdraw their name from the election by filing a written notice with the Center for Student Engagement Staff stating their withdrawal.
 - 2) The deadline for withdrawing from the Primary Elections shall be the end of the Candidates' Meeting.
 - 3) The deadline for withdrawing from the General Elections shall be five (5) business days prior to the General Elections **s**.
- d) DEPOSIT:
 - 1) The Candidates for all positions shall be required to submit a **fifty-dollar** (\$50.00) **campaign** deposit
 - 2) The deposit shall be used to coerce compliance by the candidates of the provisions contained within the Elections **s** Code.
 - 3) Some or all of the deposit may be withheld due to noncompliance of the Elections **s** Code.

- 4) The remainder of the deposit will be returned to the candidates following the certification of the election results if no cases are pending due to noncompliance of the Elections Code.
- 5) Any candidate that fails to submit their campaign deposit to the designated location by the designated date and time may be removed from the election effective immediately per the authority of the Director of Elections and Democratic Education.

1 *Whereas*, the 87th Session of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada previously
2 established its legislative priorities to consist of safety, transportation, sexual assault prevention,
3 sustainability, affordable housing, and affordable education;¹

4 *Whereas*, the legislative priorities serve as an enumeration of the primary concerns held by the
5 Association, with the Department of Legislative Affairs advocating on matters pertaining to said
6 priorities to any governing or legislative body with the potential to affect students of the Association,
7 on a university, local, state, or federal level;

2 constituents to further the interests of its legislative priorities;

3 *Whereas*, pursuant to S.Res 87-87, A Resolution in Support of Taking Action Against White
4 Supremacy on Campus², the 87th Session of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada
5 recognized diversity, equity, and inclusion to be three matters directly related to the wellbeing of the
6 campus community;

7 *Whereas*, in line with A Resolution in Support of Taking Action Against White Supremacy on
8 Campus, the Association shall incorporate diversity, equity, and inclusion into the 87th Session's
9 legislative priorities;

10 *Be it resolved*, the 87th Session of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada's legislative
11 priorities are safety, transportation, sexual assault prevention, sustainability, affordable housing,
12 affordable education, diversity, equity, and inclusion;

13 *Be it further resolved*, The Department of Legislative Affairs shall create events, conduct outreach,
14 and advocate on behalf of the students on issues pertaining to the legislative priorities of the 87th
15 session to the applicable governing bodies;

16 *Be it further resolved*, The Senate of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada write
17 legislation pertaining to the 87th session's legislative priorities;

18 *Be it further resolved*, this resolution supersedes any previous resolution outlining the legislative
19 priorities of the 87th Session of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada;

20 *Be it further resolved*, a copy of this resolution be sent to President of the Associated Students of
21 the University of Nevada, Anthony Martinez, Chair of the Committee on Public Affairs, Isabel
22 Westerman, and Director of Legislative Affairs, Joko Cailles.

To Amend Title II, Chapter 205 of the Statues of the Associated Students

- 1 *Whereas*, Title II, Chapter 205 of the S.A.S outlines the creation and duties of the Attorney
2 General;
- 3 *Whereas*, Title VII, Chapter 701 of the S.A.S, Elections, contained duties of the Attorney
4 General not found in the Attorney General’s section: Title VII, Chapter 205, Section 02: Duties;
- 5 *Whereas*, the differing job duties for the Attorney General found in both Chapters 701 and 205
6 need to be placed in one location, Title II, Chapter 205, Section 02: Duties;
- 7 *Whereas*, having the duties of the Attorney General in one location will help with issues of
8 accountability and transparency;
- 9 *Be it enacted*, that Senate of the Associated Students amend the Statutes of the Associated
10 Students Title II, Chapter 205 to reflect the changes in Addendum A.

Addendum A

CHAPTER 205: ATTORNEY GENERAL

SECTION 01: ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby an Attorney General, appointed by the President, with the consent of the Senate.

SECTION 02: DUTIES

The duties of the Attorney General are:

- g) The Attorney General shall prosecute any case, at the Attorney General's ~~own~~ **or Judicial Council's** discretion, filed by a third party, even in cases where the plaintiff seeks to dismiss the charge.
- h) The Attorney General shall act as the representative **of the Director of Elections and Democratic Education** ~~of the Commission~~ before the ASUN Judicial Council.
- i) The Attorney General shall ensure that all regulations concerning petitions are followed fully.
- j) The Attorney General shall deliver **and provide for** all petitions **(for each election) or for initiative and referendums** to the President of the Associated Students **and the Director of Elections and Democratic** before the Candidates' Meeting.
- k) The Attorney General shall assist any student interested in writing a petition for initiative and referendum.
- ~~l) The Attorney General shall provide all of the petitions for each election to the Director of Elections and Democratic Education before the Candidates' Meeting~~
- l) The Attorney General shall certify that a petition question is an impartial and accurate description of the proposal and shall assign the petition an Official Name and Number, to, if the petition creates a law, prepare an Official Summary of the petition, to confer with the office of Legal Counsel or designee for approval of language on questions of student fees, and to create the petition and return to the Primary Proponent three (3) copies of the petition.
- m) The Attorney General shall verify that there are a sufficient number of valid signatures on each petition, by checking the student status of each person who signed the petition, to immediately notify the Primary Proponent(s) if the verifying official discovers that the petition submitted lacks sufficient valid signatures, and to preserve the petition for the same time period as the Director of Elections and Democratic Education preserves the ballots for the election for which the petition qualified or attempted to qualify for placement on the ballot.
- n) The Attorney General shall notify Candidates and all others cited of charges during elections.
- o) The Attorney General shall supervise ballot tabulation.
- p) The Attorney General shall release the election results as soon as possible.
- q) The Attorney General shall attend or send a representative to all physical polling locations and places where ballots are kept and tabulated, provided such representative is not a candidate or agent in the election.
- r) **To carry out such other functions and duties as required under the constitution and laws**
- s) **The Attorney General shall not prosecute any case to which the Attorney General is a party or in which the Attorney General has an interest in the outcome as described in subsection 3, Title III, Chapter 302, Rule 3a. When such a conflict occurs, the Chair of Government Operations shall act as a special prosecutor to act as and perform the elections duties of the Attorney General insofar as the Attorney General's conflict is concerned.**

5 Chapter 205, the origin of their stated duties, and were therefore not needed to be repeated;

6 *Whereas*, Section 03: Composition of this chapter only reflected the duties of the Attorney

7 General with no respect to the position of Director of Elections and Democratic Education, even though

8 that position is explicitly mentioned many times in the S.A.S.;

9 *Whereas*, the Director of Elections and Democratic Engagement position is a position hired by the

10 Center for Student Engagement Staff;

1 *Whereas*, Section 04: Composition of Duties shown in Addendum A now outlines the duties for the
2 Director of Elections and Democratic Education so the transparency of the position can be states in
3 ASUN governing documents;
4 *Be it enacted*, that Senate of the Associated Students amend the Statutes of the Associated Students
5 Title VII, Chapter 701 to reflect the changes in Addendum A.

TITLE VII: ELECTIONS

CHAPTER 701: ELECTIONS

SECTION 01: ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby established elections of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada.

~~The facilitation of elections of the Association shall be implemented collectively by student employees of the Center for Student Engagement as well as the Attorney General of the Association.~~

SECTION 02: MISSION

The mission of the facilitation of elections is to provide for a fair and efficient election for the

Association. The facilitation of elections provides an avenue for motivated Nevada students to start their understanding of a career in public service. Students become engaged locally as well as nationally and are instilled with a deep sense of leadership and civic responsibility that contributes to the development of engaged citizens.

SECTION 03: COMPOSITION FACILITATION

The facilitation of elections of the Association shall be implemented collectively by Director of Elections and Democratic Education hired by the Center for Student Engagement as well as the Attorney General of the Association.

~~The Attorney General shall have the following duties with respect to elections:~~

- ~~a) To investigate alleged violations of the Election Code and prosecute offenders before the Judicial Council.~~
- ~~b) To prosecute any case, at the Judicial Councils discretion, filed by a third party, even in cases where the plaintiff seeks to dismiss the charge.~~
- ~~c) To act as the representative of the Director of Elections and Democratic Education before the ASUN Judicial Council.~~
- ~~d) To ensure that all regulations concerning petitions are followed fully.~~
- ~~e) To deliver all petitions for initiative and referendum to the Director of Elections and Democratic Education before the Candidates' Meeting.~~
- ~~f) To carry out such other functions and duties as required under the constitution and laws.~~
- ~~g) The Attorney General shall not prosecute any case to which the Attorney General is a party or in which the Attorney General has an interest in the outcome as described in subsection 3, Title III, Chapter 302, Rule 3a. When such a conflict occurs, the Chair of Government Operations shall act as a~~

~~special prosecutor to act as and perform the elections duties of the Attorney General insofar as the Attorney General's conflict is concerned.~~

SECTION 04: COMPOSITION OF DUTIES

The Attorney General shall be involved in the ASUN Election Process with their following duties outlined in Chapter 205: Attorney General.

The following shall be considered the duties of the Director of Elections and Democratic Education:

- a) To execute the facilitation of the elections that are in accordance to the Election Code and the Association's Constitution.
- b) To facilitate the logistics of elections, including but not limited to outreach, planning workshops, building coalitions for the betterment of the elections, interpreting the SAS and Constitution, and ensuring elections are fair, equal, inclusive, and democratic.
- c) To plan all dates, deadlines, finance dues, marketing, and initiatives pertaining to elections.
- d) To create programming and initiatives that aims to educate students about democratic engagement in local, state, and national politics.

This position is to be hired by the Center for Student Engagement Professional Staff. Updates to duties in their position shall be reflected and amended in this section.

1 *Whereas*, the current club membership minimum to be recognized as an official club or
2 organization is 10 students;

3 *Whereas*, when looking at other peer institutions, the average club membership minimum is
4 anywhere between 5 to 7 members;

5 *Whereas*, by reducing the minimum number of members needed to create and maintain an active
6 club, more students will be able to participate in clubs and organizations;

7 *Whereas*, according to student feedback collected by the Department of Clubs and Orgs, when
8 creating a new club, finding the current requirement of ten members can be difficult;

Addendum A

TITLE VII. STANDING OF CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

Chapter A. Recognition and Approval of New Clubs and Organizations

Section 2 Recognition shall be based on the following:

- vii. Clubs or organizations must have no less than seven (7) undergraduate students, enrolled in seven (7) or more credits, as members, and officers shall be undergraduate student members.

Chapter B. Renewal of Clubs and Organizations

Section 1 Clubs and organizations shall update officer contact information, reconfirm advisor(s), and register seven (7) students on the club or organization's GivePulse page on or before Prep Day in the Spring semester (in preparation for the upcoming Fall semester).

Addendum B

SECTION 08: RECOGNITION OF CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

- a) Any group of at least seven (7) undergraduate students enrolled in at least seven (7) credits may petition for the recognition by ASUN. Recognition shall be granted based on the club or organization's compliance with the following terms and conditions:
 - 6) The club or organization must have at least seven (7) undergraduate students enrolled in at least seven (7) credits to become members on the club or organization's GivePulse page.
