President Hall,

I hope this memo finds you well. The Committee on Oversight, along with myself, are requesting for you to appear before our body on the **29th of April**. Due to matters brought to our attention regarding the comments you have made on Twitter recently as well as campaigning, we find it appropriate to request your appearance before the body for questioning and clarification. Listed below is our reasoning and jurisdiction to request your appearance.

According to the **Senate Rules of the 88th Session, Rule X: Standing Committee Duties, g) Committee on Oversight:**

- "...The Committee on Oversight, acting as the check on the Senate and the Executive Branch of ASUN, shall be responsible for reviewing, questioning and/or requiring updates from ASUN student officers and their respective departments."

According to the **Statutes of the Associated Students, Chapter 002: Code of Conduct, Section 02: Mission:**

- "The mission of the Associated Students of the University of Nevada is to maximize the educational experience of every student of the University of Nevada. Official positions in the Associated Students are to provide a learning experience of effective leadership, strong integrity, and a conviction for public service."

According to the **Statutes of the Associated Students, Chapter 002: Code of Conduct, Section 05: Officer Behavior:**

- a) Officers of the Associated Students shall behave in such a way as to maintain and advance the integrity of the Association's reputation while acting as an officer of the Association.
- b) ASUN officers shall hold their position in the highest regard.
- c) The reputation of the Associated Students is dependent on the trust and confidence the officers earn from the students at the University of Nevada. Officers gain credibility by

adhering to their commitments, displaying honesty and integrity, and reaching department goals solely through honorable conduct.

As an officer of the Association who has taken a sworn oath to support the Constitution and ASUN law, it is imperative that you represent the Association with “strong integrity” and “behave in such a way as to maintain and advance the integrity of the Association’s reputation.” Your recent actions have called into question your integrity as an officer of the Association and the Committee on Oversight is requesting you prepare a statement, followed by answers to questions from the body. You will be placed on the Oversight Agenda for the **29th of April**.
