AN ACT REMOVING THE ELECTIONS DEPOSIT FROM ASUN ELECTIONS

Bill Number: 17 Authored By: Senator Supple and Senator Stanfill Sponsored By: The Committee on Government Operations

Whereas, the Elections Code creates financial barriers for students who are interested in campaigning for president, vice president, or for a senator position;

Whereas, the Elections Code requires a student filing for candidacy to put down a fifty (50) dollar deposit in order to run for elections;

Whereas, the purpose of the Elections Code is to "provide for the conduct of all Association elections"

which includes punishments for violations against the Elections Code;

Whereas, not all students may have fifty (50) dollars to put towards a campaign deposit on top of other campaign finances and personal finances;

Whereas, having students put down a deposit is punitive and automatically assumes that they will be in violation of the elections fee;

Whereas, based on a University assessment of climate for learning, living, and working in July 2019 reports that low-income students were significantly less comfortable and feel less valued on campus than students who were not low-income;¹

Whereas, low-income students are at a greater disadvantage in participating on campus and "became increasingly disengaged and disconnected, their participation rates plummeting;"²

Whereas, according to No Walls 2025: A Student Vision for the University of Nevada, "additional efforts should be made to increase the number of clubs and amount of students involved in them, and should also assist in club development to improve their quality;"³

Whereas, the deposit discourages students interested in campaigning for representative positions from doing so;

Whereas, removing the elections fee will make ASUN elections more equitable to financially insecure students;

Be it enacted, Title VII, Chapter 702, Section 07, subsections d and e be removed from the Statutes of the Associated Students;

Be it further enacted, the Statutes of the Associated Students reflects the changes in Addendum A and

Addendum B.

Addendum A

Title VII Chapter 702

SECTION 07: CANDIDATE FILING PERIOD

d) ELECTIONS FEE

- 1) By filing for candidacy, the candidate consents to have a hold placed onto their account in the chance that the candidate violates the election code and is charged by the Judicial Council.
- 2) A hold will not be placed on a candidates account if they do not allocate any charges due to noncompliance with the Elections Code.
- 3) If a candidate is found to violate the Elections Code by the Judicial Council, there will be a hold placed onto their account until they pay the fee (determined by the Judicial Council) to the Center of Student Engagement.
- 4) Any candidate that allocates charges totaling to fifty (50) dollars will be disqualified from ASUN elections due to noncompliance of the Elections Code. The student will have a hold placed onto their account and will have to pay fifty (50) dollars' worth of charges to the Center of Student Engagement to remove the hold on their account.

Addendum B

Title VII Chapter 702

SECTION 14: PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATIONS OF CAMPAIGN

c) A finding of violation of the conduct prohibited by this Election Code shall be punishable by withholding a portion of the Candidate's deposit charging a candidate no less than five dollars to be payable to the Center of Student Engagement. A hold will be placed onto the candidate's account until the charge is paid in full.
