c. Overlapping Liaison Positions

- Speaker Thompson introduced the ongoing issue of overlapping liaison positions across
 different Committees, stating that the organizations to which ASUN reaches out had expressed
 confusion about who was their proper point of contact inside the Association. He briefly
 outlined the overlapping liaison positions to his knowledge at the time.
- The Committee discussed the matter. Senator Bergren commented that she had discussed breaking up the positions with her Committee members, while Speaker Pro Tempore pointed out how some Committees (e.g., the Committee on Safety, Sustainability, and Wellness) are required per the governing documents to retain liaison contacts. Speaker Thompson then noodled on the ways Committees could share contacts, citing how different Committees may require similar organizations to hold events or promote initiatives.
- Speaker Thompson postponed Committee conversation to the following Committee on Oversight meeting, citing Senator Gonzalez's absence.

d. ASUN Code of Ethics

- Parliamentarian Taeubel delivered a presentation on his ASUN Code of Ethics legislation up for referral at the upcoming Senate of the Associated Students meeting. He explained that the legislation would establish a non-enforceable, supplementary document alongside ASUN's existing governing documents outlining proper Association conduct and values.
- Parliamentarian Taeubel asked the Committee for feedback on the Code of Ethics, considering
 their direct role in holding Senators accountable. They discussed the non-enforceability of the
 document, with Speaker Thompson and Speaker Pro Tempore proposing that the Committee on
 Oversight hold the Code in high regard regardless of enforceability and use it as a basis to invite
 in Senators and appeal to them for good behavior.
