The Senate considered agenda item 11C, the appointment of Kaylee Radke to the vacant Senate seat for the School of Social Work. Radke, an incoming junior and president of the Social Work Student Advisory Board, presented her goals of amplifying student voices, promoting inclusivity, improving communication with administration, advocating for mental health, and ensuring fair internships. She also expressed interest in serving on the Committees on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion; Safety, Sustainability, and Wellness; and Democratic and Civic Engagement.

During questioning, Senator Terry asked about internships and field placements, Speaker Pro Tempore Moss asked about mentoring interns, Senator Castro asked about increasing engagement in the College of Social Work, Senator Issa requested specific committee goals, and Senator Hotelling (via Zoom) asked about college-specific priorities. In deliberations, Senator Terry, Speaker Pro Tempore Moss, and Senator Castro all spoke in support of Radke's appointment. The Senate voted unanimously to confirm her as Senator for the School of Social Work.
