- a. Chair, Committee on Academics and Student Affairs, Michael Nubel- No report at this time.
- b. Chair, Committee on Budget and Finance, Henry Lawson- No report at this time.
- c. Chair, Committee on Democratic Civic Engagement, Kaylee Radtke- Reports that with being gone for so long she hasn't been able to agendize a meeting in June and as compensation she will be having two meetings in July.

The Department of Sustainability is planning their first cleanup on August 22nd and the committee is planning an event on September 17th.
- g. Chair, Special Committee on Food Insecurity, Alexander Saporito- Reports that the committee had met the previous Friday and he is planning to have their next meeting mid to late July.
- h. Parliamentarian, Faith Strabala- No report at this time.
- i. Speaker Pro Tempore, Dominic Evans- Reports that the ASUN internship marketing is going through the final rounds of approval. He will be checking in with Director Mendoza to make sure the marketing is really good.

- j. Chair, Committee on Oversight, Jason Issa- Reports that Senate will be meeting biweekly through out the rest of the summer. Senior Associate Director Koeckes has informed him that the UNR department of communications has interest in creating a new ASUN website. He had a meeting with previous Senator on establishing a relationship between ASUN and the Office of Title IX. 8. REPORTS (INFORMATION ONLY)

- a. **Chair, Committee on Academics and Student Affairs, Michael Nubel-** No report at this time.
- b. **Chair, Committee on Budget and Finance, Henry Lawson-** “I don't have too much of a report to give, and I'm still struggling with figuring out how to try to meet. I'm still working with Amy and Luis. Amy suggests an idea of just fast-tracking our pieces through Senate, or first reading of bill cannot be at the moment. To do things in a timely manner, I guess.”
- i. Senator Barrus asks what the issue was in planning the July meeting.
 - ii. Senator Lawson answers that only three members were able to attend that meeting so they would not have made quorum.
 - iii. Speaker Issa asks when the next earliest time the committee would be able to meet.
 - iv. Senator Lawson responds that it would most likely be the middle of August.
- c. **Chair, Committee on Democratic Civic Engagement, Kaylee Radtke-** “So DCE's meeting this Thursday at 3 in the President's Conference Room conference room, we're not gonna be talking about much, considering we just had a meeting two weeks ago, but I wanted to do two in one month, just because we didn't meet in June. And then for the meeting that we had 2 weeks ago. For some reason, Zoom will not let me not put a passcode. I'm trying to figure it out. So, we'll have a passcode this one, this meeting too, but I put it on the agenda. That was an issue for Senator Horvath, last meeting, he couldn't get in, and he was traveling in his car. I'm going to excuse his, tardy unexcused, or absence unexcused, to Absence excused, because it wasn't really his fault, and he had let me know, so that's basically all for me. Thank you, guys.”
- d. **Chair, Committee on Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Accessibility, Viviana Castro-** “Just a brief one. The committee is going to be meeting this upcoming Thursday at 12pm. We are going to be discussing our potential Pride involvement. For the last 2 years, I believe the committee has been doing a little bit in collaboration with the Title IX office, and also the Office of DEI to do something for Pride, so we'll probably be adding on to that again this year, but you're all invited. Is what I want to say, if we do table at Pride, which we'll be discussing. And then also, that's pretty much it. So, yeah.”
- e. **Chair, Committee on Government Operations, Lance Zuniga-** No report at this time.
- f. **Chair, Committee on Safety, Sustainability and Wellness, Anna Barrus-** “I am sorry to the members of my committee and the members of Oversight. I know I said I was gonna meet last week or this week, but unfortunately, I do work nights, and I have not been able to find a time that works with my schedule, just to be able to chair the meetings, and with Senator Saporito being in Vegas, I think it's best to have the person chairing the meeting here in Reno. Trying to work through my work schedule, it should be more consistent, within the following

week, but I'm hoping to meet next week, on Friday with SSW. We do have one piece to be seen, and we don't really have anything pertinent to be discussed other than that. But yes, thank you.”

- g. Chair, Special Committee on Food Insecurity, Alexander Saporito-** “Our last meeting we had was on the 24th. We discussed a brief timeline for the committee looking at initiatives that we can do from September to April. We passed SBR94, and this was a bill regarding, like, funding a feasibility study, for pack revisions potentially moving to Sierra Hall. During the meeting, we just analyzed the piece and I met with Luis just to make sure we could iron out any details. And the committee's happy with either sending it to BNF or fast-tracking for Senate. Whichever one's most beneficial during the session? Furthermore, we're working with Executive Cabinet right now, me and my vice chair, on developing a potential fundraiser during Homecoming week, and right now we're, in progress of contacting, like, Matty Wilson, Tony Ortega, and the rest of the exec board, so if you guys want any extra info on that, let me know. That's pretty much it.”
- h. Parliamentarian, Faith Strabala-** No report at this time.
- i. Speaker Pro Tempore, Dominic Evans-** “We had our posts, go live on Instagram a little bit ago. I hope you guys enjoyed it. I, I tried my best to work Canva Pro, and I thought it did... I thought it was pretty good, so if you have any questions about that, just let me know. Another thing, I'll get the syllabus sent to the, Teams chat, I just forgot about that, so I'll just send that, like, Wednesday when I'm in Chicago, and I will whenever I have service on my iPad. So, besides that, I spoke to, Chief of Staff Atkinson a little bit. We're kind of in, like, this waiting period for a little few weeks before it can really do much more marketing. We are planning on reaching out to a ton of professors, getting it on Canvas pages, just to really push out this, internship stuff. So yeah, that's about it.”
- j. Chair, Committee on Oversight, Jason Issa-** “So, first of all, addressing the issues with our meetings online. Thank you to everyone who, sent me all of your, agendas and stuff. We just, I need to get all this that way, get sent into IT so they can add those back to the ASERT website. I spoke with Justin a little bit, and he honestly has no idea what was going on. He was looking at, like, the input onto the website, and no one ended up removing the meetings, they just kind of disappeared for some unknown tech reasons, so, hopefully that won't be an issue once we do eventually move over to the UNR website instead of our, current, Work space, site. I also met with, Director Cook, on Saturday to discuss event sustainability best practices, and thank you to Senator Radkeke for attending. We just kind of went over some events that committees hold, and some events that I plan on holding later on this session, for Senate, and just kind of to talk about what would be the most sustainable way to actually hold those, events, and if you have any questions regarding that, please direct, questions to, Director Cook. I'm also scheduled a meeting with Director Edmondson on August 4th from the Title IX office alongside Senator Castro and Senator Espinoza, just to discuss, kind of, introduce ourselves to the Senate body to Director Edmondson, and to get her to present the Senate, regarding Title IX. I've also been working on the composite for the 94th session, and I've reached out to some senators to get a headshot from y'all, and also reached out to the secretaries to get a headshot as well, because I would like to really include the Office of the Secretary in this one. And so that should be ready by the time we get back, for our first meeting over the summer, and my plan is to have all of y'all sign the back of the composite, so that, like, you know, just a cool artifact for future sessions to get a hold of what else besides the points memo? There's something else. Yeah, so our next meeting this Wednesday, we'll be having the Office of Marketing Communications come present regarding the university rebrand. That's all that's on the agenda. I've also been reaching out to other

university offices to get them to come present up to, the Senate. I don't have an official timeline for that quite yet, but over the fall, I expect have a wide variety of on-campus offices come and presenting, such as police services, veteran services, and, especially parking services. Lastly, the current attendance points memo is as follows: Senator Cain: 2, Senator Lawson: 1, Senator Potter: 2.3, Senator Price: 1, Senator Rivers: 3.3, Parliamentarian Strabala: 1, Senator Zuniga: 1.3”

a. Points Evaluation

- i. Speaker Issa reads Senator Wilson’s testimony, “I was at work on Wednesday, and they asked me to stay a little late to finish up a task. The Senate meeting slipped my mind and told a message before it started. I texted Jason as quick as I could, telling him I wouldn't be able to make it. I got out of work at 5.45, and then drove 40 minutes home, and by the time I could have been able to join the meeting was over. Sorry for sending the text a little late, I understand if the points don't get resolved.”
- ii. Senator Barrus says that she believes that the points awarded to Senator Wilson should be alleviated.
- iii. Speaker Issa seeks a motion to remove two points awarded to Senator Wilson on July 15th though unanimous consent.
- iv. So moved by Senator Barrus.
- v. Second by Senator Lawson.
- vi. The motion passes unanimously.
- vii. Senator Lawson testifies for two meetings, “I got two meetings I wanted to provide testimony for. There was,
- viii. 1 Senate meeting, where I was going to come over, and then I had embarrassingly locked my keys in my car. So I was needing to get in there. And then I was going to hop on Zoom, but right as I went to go hop on Zoom, the tow truck guy that I called pulled up, so he was helping me get into my car while the meeting was going, and then when he was done the meeting was over. And then for the Oversight meeting I missed. I missed the Oversight meeting, because I've been so busy with working jobs that I've kind of been out of senate, which I do regret, but I had gotten logged out of Teams, and I hadn't realized, so I hadn't gotten any notifications about the meeting, or the meeting was coming up, so I was unaware about it”
- ix. Senator Barrus says that same thing with Senator Wilson, with this being summer everyone is not as focused on making sure that they are on top of all of their meetings and we shouldn't be punishing people for things outside of their control.
- x. Speaker Issa seeks a motion to excuse Senator Lawson's points from the June 17th Senate meeting and the July 1st Command Oversight meeting through unanimous consent.
- xi. So moved by Senator Barrus.
- xii. Second by Senator Radke.
- xiii. The motion passes unanimously.

b. Senate Expectations Document Review

- i. Senator Barrus comments “I did read over the document. I don't think that there's anything I would change at this time, but then again, I think it should be a living, breathing document. It should change with time and as you kind of move

forward as speaker, I think that you'll have different expectations, and you know, you might see different rules that might change. But I think as it stands right now, I think it's a good document, and I think that it matches what we should be going into the fall semester. So right now, I don't think that I see any revisions that need to be changed. I think that probably in the future, we'll probably see some come up, as a committee on Oversight, but, as of right now, I don't see any"

c. Committee Updates

- i. **Senator Lawson comments, "We've been struggling a lot with, quorum.** Finding a time that works for everyone. And we were planning on meeting next week, but I'll be out of town, so first school to have that meeting, but we have Senator Barrus to chair it. In my previous update, I mentioned, I think suggested that we just fast-track some of the pieces. We have three pieces that we're trying to review. The field piece, the Further education scholarship program. For the Furthering Education Scholarship Program, I feel like it'd be okay to fast track it, especially since it's going to Gov Ops as well."
- ii. Senator Barrus adds, "I do admire that we're trying to do, trying to pass these pieces in a timely manner. However, I believe that there's a reason why committees exist, and why we need to be able to have these pieces go through committee to work out the fine details and amend the pieces as needed before it hits the table. It also helps when we're actually at Senate, for good time purposes, to make sure that we're not discussing the same point over and over and over, it's not redundant. I also spoke with, President Moss about the Furthering Education Scholarship Program, and he does not want it to be fast-tracked. We think it's best to work out the kinks in committee. So I hope that we are able to have a meeting, next week, and if anything, I can help you agendize with anything you need as your Vice Chair, and help you chair as well, to make sure that the meeting happens. But other than that, I think that's where my points stand. That's it. Thank you."
- iii. Senator Castro comments, "I'll be honest, my issue was similar to Senator Lawson, which is actually just that my committee members have very contrary schedules. And even on my when to meet for the summer, I have to... there's people who don't actually, like, cannot fit into any particular meeting time together. Either way, though, I think we're doing okay, and we'll just be meeting, like I said, this upcoming Thursday. So, it's still something we're getting around. And I think that, like you said, the fall schedules being concrete will help everyone a lot more."

d. Senate Overview

- i. **Senator Sopotito comments, "I think, Senate is going pretty well, especially since it's the summer and everyone is out working,** you know, just trying to get all their money up for the next semester. Good job with getting more people to turn on their cameras for the Zoom. Regarding legislation, I really think that's gonna start increasing in frequency when we actually all get back into campus. So, at least from you know, where I sit, I'm not really worried about any Senate issues at all."
- ii. Speaker Issa adds, All right, well, my opinion is that the site's going pretty well so far. The last meeting where we met in Azaria was a little bit rough, because we were having tech issues, and the tech guy could not make it. And given that we're meeting in

Ansari this week, I'm gonna be contacting Tech to make sure that's resolved before the date of the meeting. But, you know, I think because right now it is summer, everyone, obviously, like, y'all should be enjoying your vacation. I don't want everyone to be focused on ASUN at this time. But when we do get back in summer, as, like, every speaker before me would say, that's when things really, kick off. You'll be on campus, you'll be in the midst of everyone, so naturally, things will just kind of speed up, and hopefully, once we get everyone's fall-winter meets set up, then we'll stop having quorum issues, but if not, we'll find some other routes to solve that issue. Yeah, I don't think we're having any problems, really. I think people have been making their voices heard when needed. Yeah, that's kind of what I think.”
